CONTRACTS OF INSURANCE

The purpose of this Supplement, which is issued in accordance with the powers delegated by HM Treasury, is to withdraw the permission for payments in respect of contracts of insurance (including reinsurance) to be made by payments to "Iraqi Accounts" in the United Kingdom. With effect from the date of this Supplement, such payments may only be made if permission for the payment or for the class of payments within which the payment falls is given on behalf of HM Treasury by the Secretary of State for Trade and Industry. Further information about the need for permission is contained in the DTI Press Notice dated 12 September 1990.

- 2 Accordingly, delete paragraph 9 as inserted by Supplement No. 1 and substitute the following:

"Payments ordered by or on behalf of residents of Iraq

- 9(a) Any payment required by an order given by or on behalf of the government of Iraq or a resident of Iraq to a person subject to the directions (see paragraph 4) is prohibited except with permission. Permission will not be given for payments to meet calls under contract bonds. Nor will permission normally be given for any payment to any account held outside the United Kingdom. Subject to paragraph 9(b) below permission is hereby given for any other payment whether in sterling or in foreign currency to be made to a "Iraqi Account" in the United Kingdom. No payment or transfer may be made from one "Iraqi Account" to another "Iraqi Account" without permission, which will not normally be given.

- (b) Payment to "Iraqi Accounts" in respect of contracts of insurance (including reinsurance) will require the permission of the Secretary of State for Trade and Industry."
