
Dear Sir

With regard to the forthcoming review and renewal of the B B C's Charter, I would ask you to require the B B C to extend to Christianity the same respect that it extends to the world's other major religions, notably Islam and Judaism.

The B B C appears to me not to like Christianity, and its bias shows clearly in its coverage of anything to do with it. Thus, a panel assembled to discuss a Christian topic will normally consist of one Christian and three non-Christians. Whereas a panel discussing a subject close to the B B C's heart (e.g. Homosexuality, or the Gulf war) will normally consist of three "fors" and one "anti".

Also, would you ask them to cut down on the frequency with which God's and Christ's name is taken in vain in plays, comedy shows, and chat shows. We do not hear "Good Allah" or "by the Prophet" on their programmes!
