I am contacting you regarding your leaflet, 'Your B.B.C. your say'.

Overhaul all B.B.C. publicly funded services cover everything satisfactory.

The one change I would like to happen is digital channel (S) for sport on Freeview, Sky and cable. This provides effective and efficient method for viewers of B.B.C. One and 1 or two, not to have there programmes rescheduled for live or pre-recorded sport.
