The aspects I value most about the BBC are the TV Channels - BBC1 and BBC2. As well as the CBeebies, CBBC and sometimes the news. There are because these channels serve different nations, by using different people to present the shows, e.g. nationalities.

Also each channel has a different region, this is by the channels being very educational for young children. I think we should pay for the BBC, by licence fee. So that everyone knows about it and understands the terms and conditions. Also the BBC should carry on running commercial

operations, to insist that everyone reads the worldwide news.

I do suggest that the BBC is organized and efficient, but it needs to be more lively and welcoming on the news, with more smiling faces.

The BBC should be regulated by public interests, meeting their standards on accuracy for each community, impartiality, as well as fair trading.

Also the public show have a greater say to influence everyone about the standards of BBC, by doing comment-alos and interviews to suggest everyone's opinions, e.g. like newsrounds.
