Dear Sirs and Mesdames,


In response to your request for the British public to give its views on the BBC I respectfully submit the following:-

The list of key questions drawn up by you does cover important aspects for consideration but does not, regrettably, include the most important of all, that concerning the content of programmes.

What does it matter, for example, how the BBC is financed or whether it should run commercial services when so many of the programmes portray violence and gross immorality? Both are already widespread in the country with dire consequences for all concerned and both are rapidly increasing in extent. There can be no doubt that T.V., that most potent educator, is one of the major causes of that increase as viewers, especially the younger ones, emulate what they so frequently see on the screen.

The elimination of such programmes would certainly be for the good of everyone in the country and would justify the word "Culture" in the title of your department.
