Dear Sirs


We are responding to your invitation in the national press.

We are also aware of the general terms under which the BBC was set up
Under Lord Reith.

Over our 60-70 years adult life we feel that the BBC has rendered
excellent service to this country and to many others, especially during
the 1939-45 war years.

It is our view that the BBC should remain a licence funded non
commercial-advertising broadcaster with the present number of digital
TV channels and the present number of digital/analogue FM radio channels.

The BBC should remain a high quality public service broadcaster.
We would like to think that this letter is seen by the present Director
General. We would propose to copy it to our MP after the forthcoming
General Election.
