
My comments specifically apply to the quality and content of your

- 3 There is far too much sexual emphasis in some programmes, many times irrelevant to the content of the programme.
- 4 There is not enough good quality humour. Most of the so-called comedians rely on so much lavatorial "humour". What we want is more of the likes of the "Two Ronnies Sketchbook".
- 5 Cut out the "make-overs" and many of the gardening programmes.
- 6 It has to be said that wild-life type, and travel type programmes are not only enjoyable, but always instructional.
- 7 Certainly more good Drama, and certainly fewer "soaps"

Finally, we need to return to the days when the BBC was respected World-wide for high quality un-biased programmes, and with the use of good quality "English", understandable to all.

I am convinced that the use of bad language, and the portrayal of too much sex and violence is affecting the morals of the youth of this wonderful Country of ours.
