Trusted Computing (TC) is a technology promoted by the Trusted Computing Group (TCG) and means that a computer platform will behave consistently in specific ways, and those behaviours will be forced by hardware and software. The TCG is a not-for-profit organisation formed to develop, define and promote open specifications for trusted computing and security technologies, including hardware building blocks and software interfaces, across multiple platforms, peripherals and devices.
