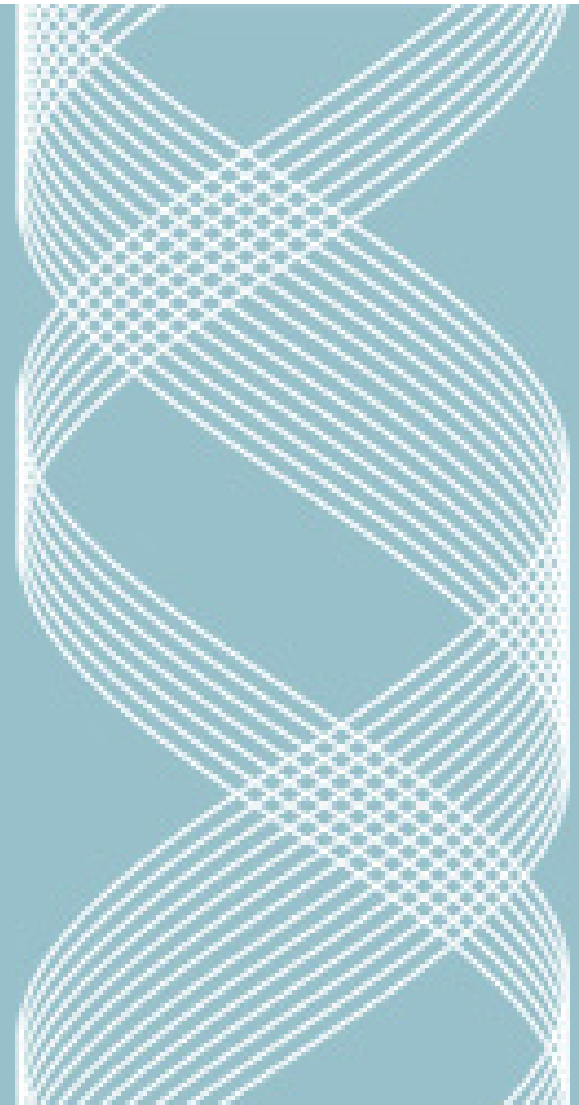

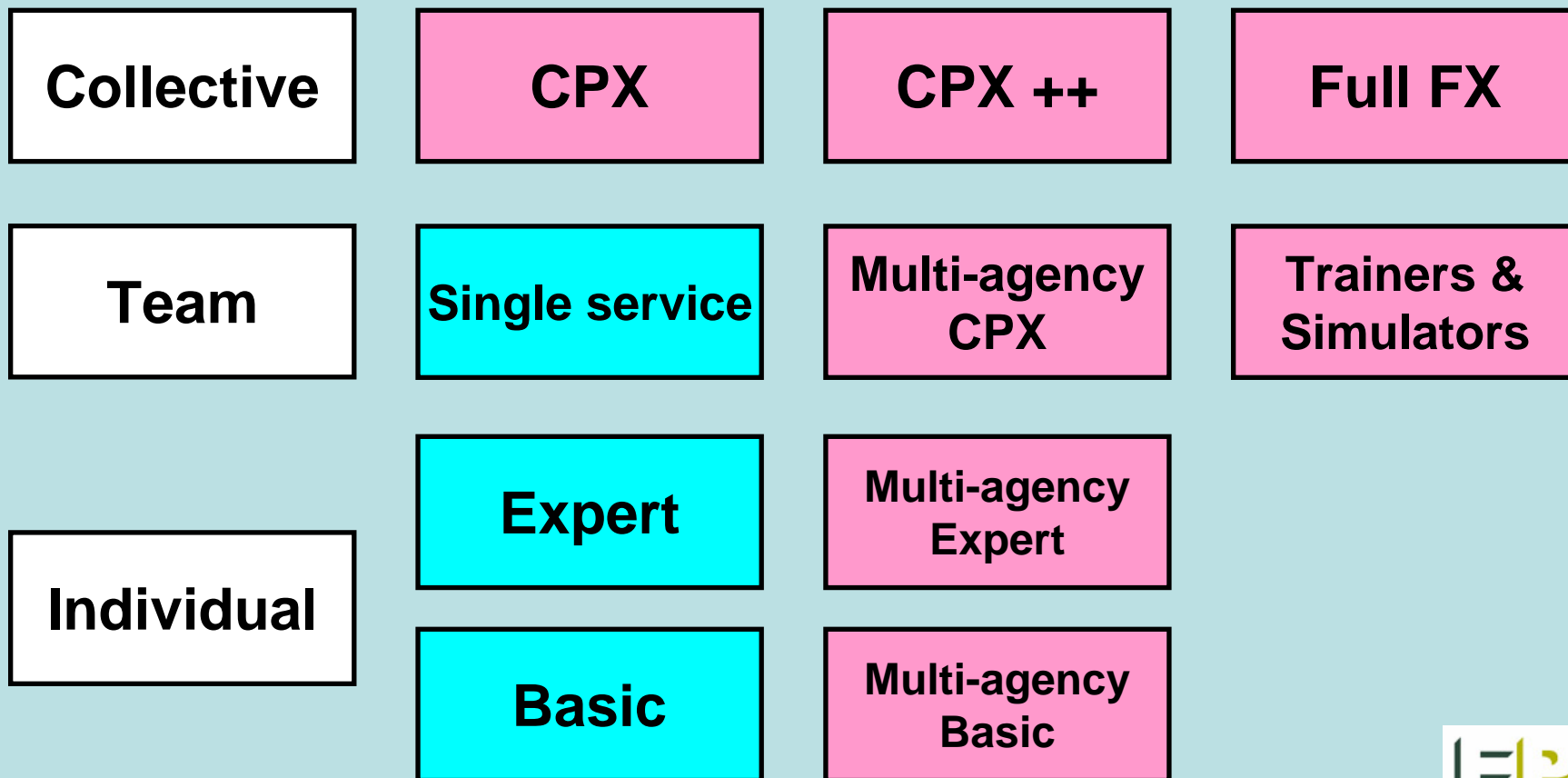


Aim

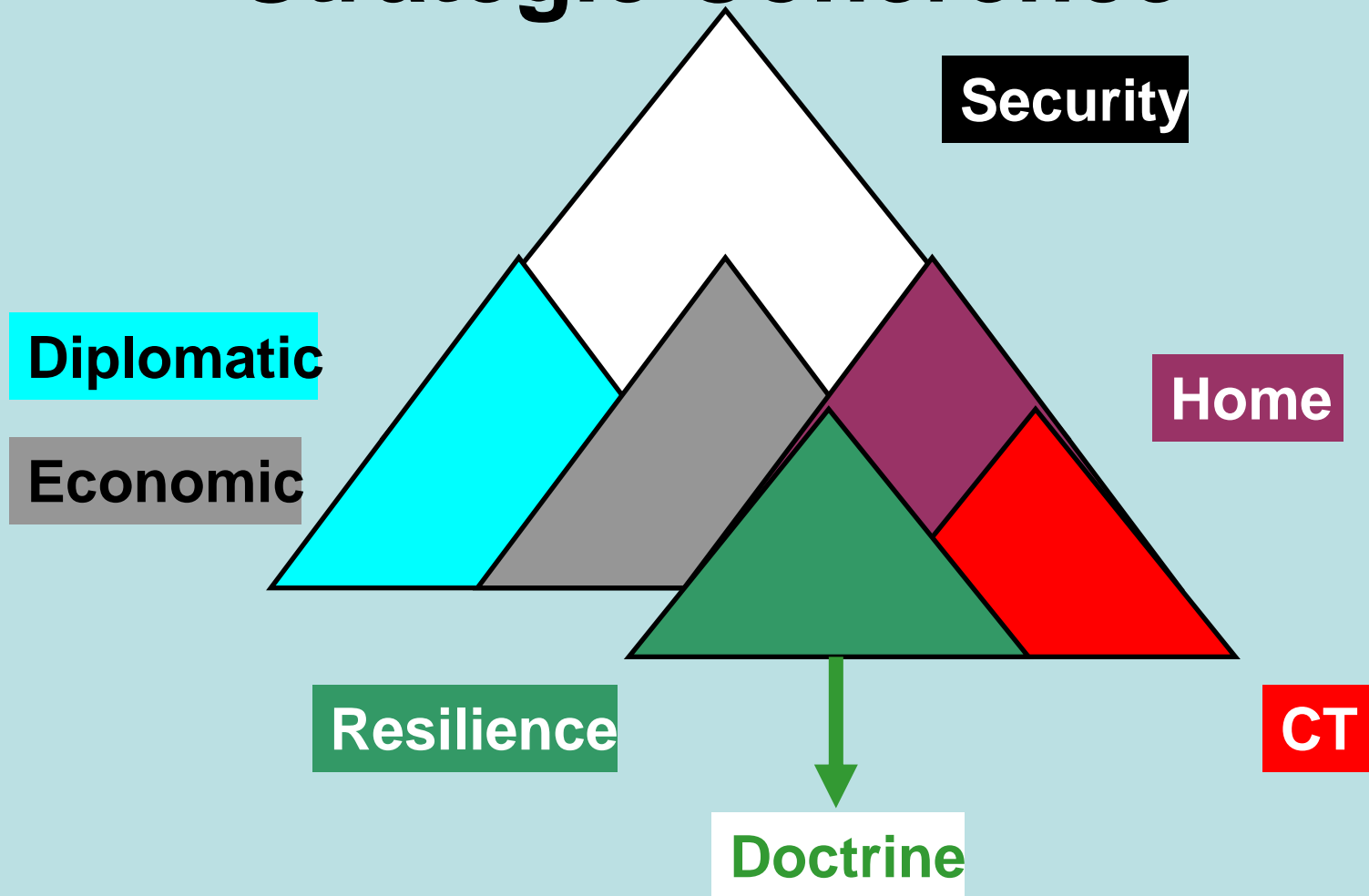

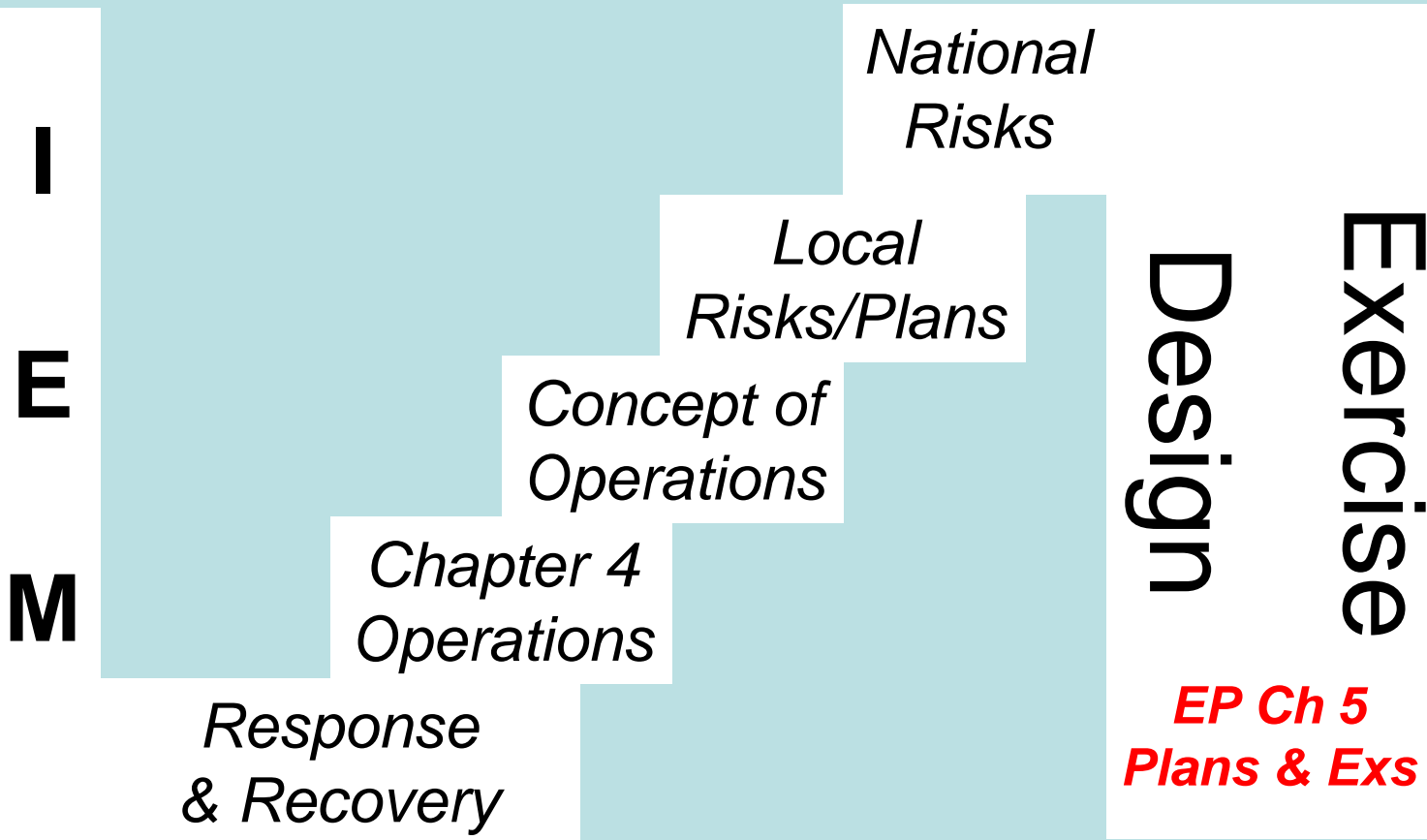

Individual Multi-Agency Basic

Staff with contingency roles

- Locally delivered

Team Multi-Agency

Essential component of operational effectiveness

- CPX – from table-top to full command team in control centre
- The ‘1 down’ principle
- Training in depth 1st – 4th teams
- Role of technology



Technology in Team Training

- Well established in single-service & military
- Controllable & repeatable environment
- Procedure
- Performance measurement
- Reduced control overheads
- Effectiveness & efficiency
- Role of central government

Gold Standard

- Multi-agency command team training support system
- Project management by DPA (JBTSE IPT)
- Requirement capture underway (QinetiQ)
 - RRFs & selected LRFs Yorks, NE, SE, London
- Competitive tender 2006
- Target ISD 2007

Collective Training

- Culmination of training cycle
- Clarity amidst multiple aims
 - Training (*whom?*)
 - Testing (*what? whom?*)
- Role of external support (*‘1 & 2 levels down’*)
- Lesson capture
- Exercises within exercises
- National coherence
