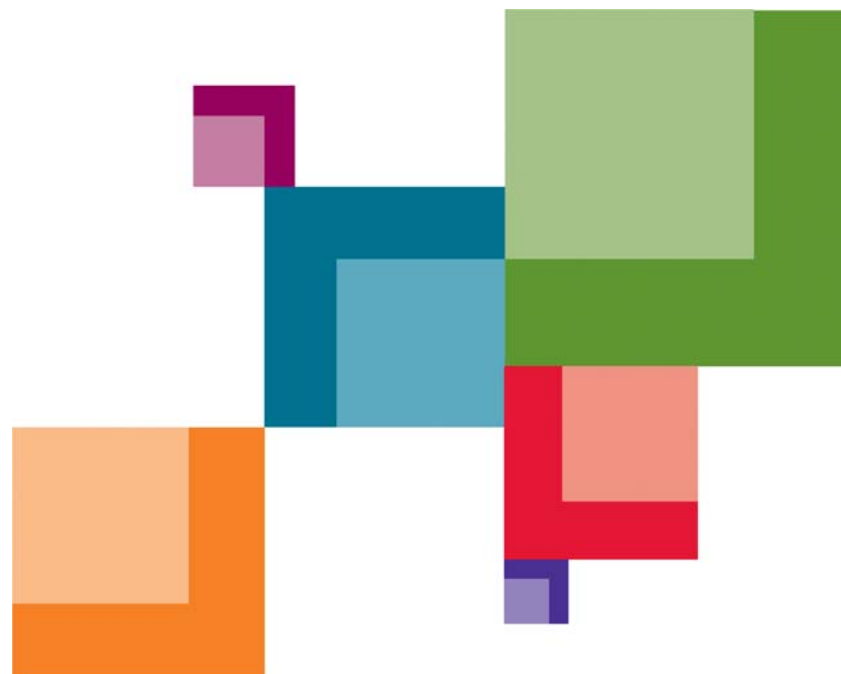




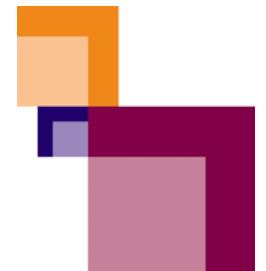

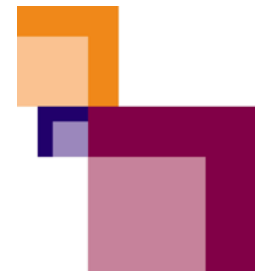

Aim of this slide pack

- This slide pack presents baseline and proxy data on the indicators for the socially excluded adults PSA for the North East region. The information contained within is intended to inform Local Area Agreement (LAA) negotiations between the Government Office for the North East and the region's local authorities.
- This slide pack is not intended to highlight poor performance but rather to assist with priority setting and planning for delivery.

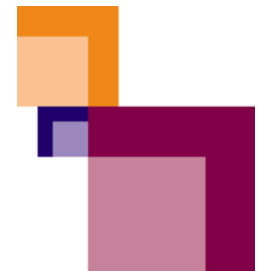


Overview of the socially excluded adults PSA

The aim of the socially excluded adults PSA is to ensure that the most socially excluded adults are offered the chance to get back on a path to a more successful life, by increasing their chances of achieving settled accommodation and employment, education or training.

The PSA focuses on four at-risk client groups:

- adults (young people aged 19) leaving care
- adult offenders (aged 18+) released from custody and on community sentences
- adults (aged 18+) in contact with secondary mental health services
- adults (aged 18+) with learning disabilities known to Councils with Adult Social Service Responsibilities (CASSRs)



A total of 8 indicators underpin the PSA

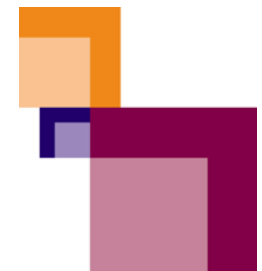

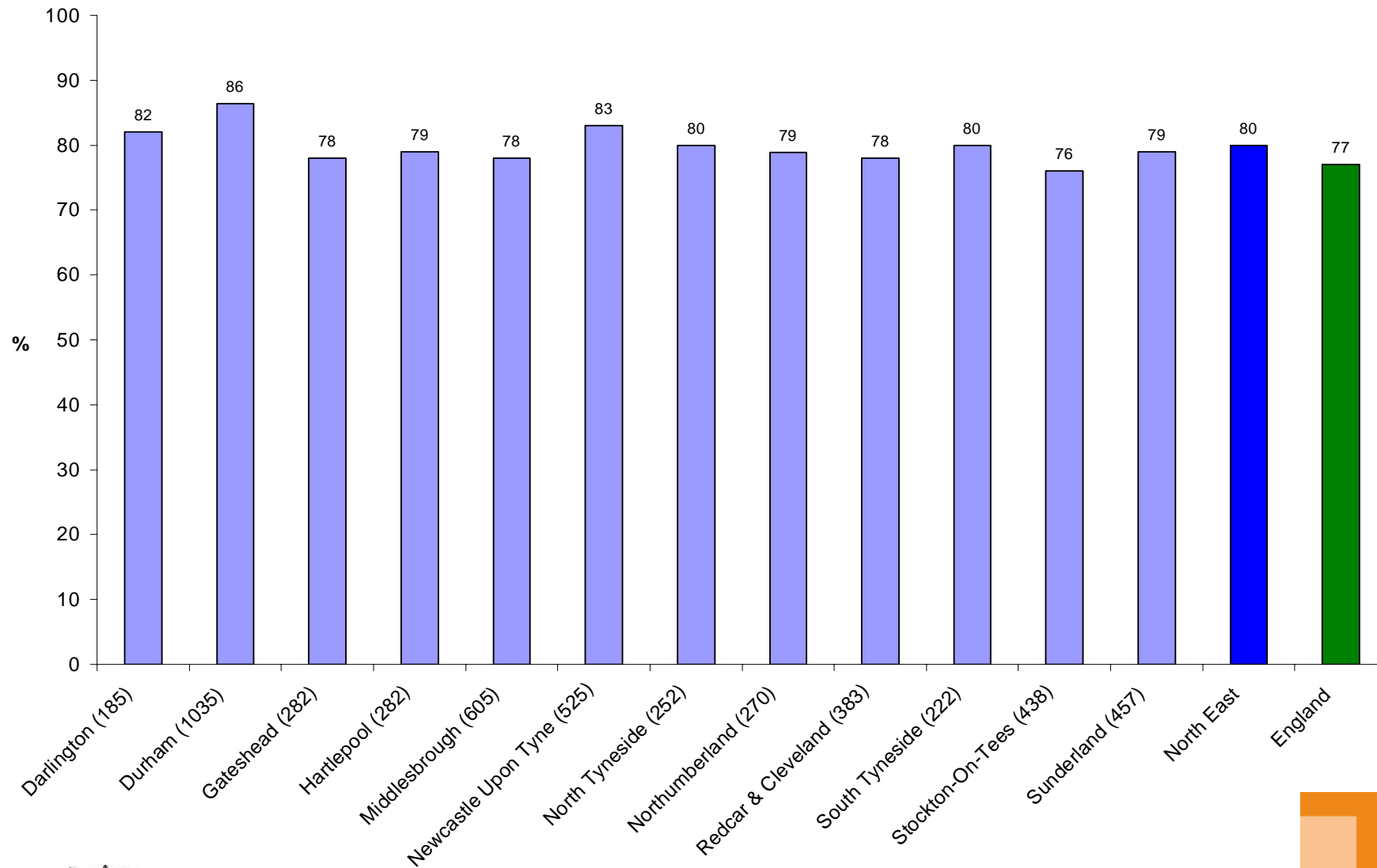

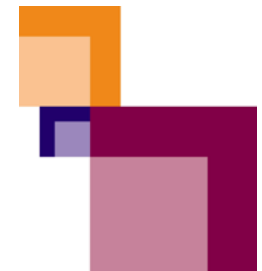


Latest data on the % of offenders in settled and suitable accommodation, 2006/07*

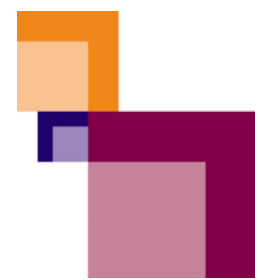
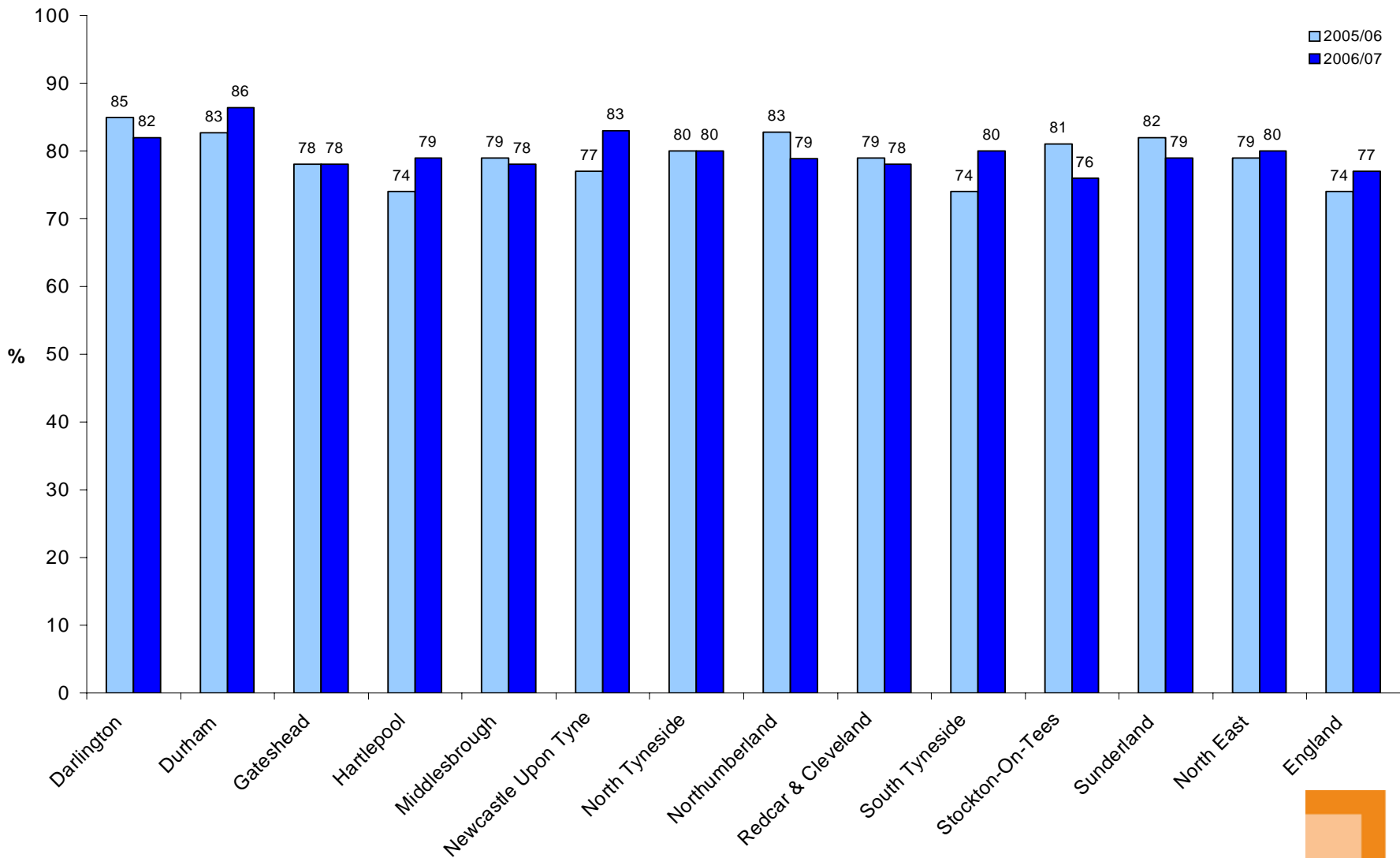

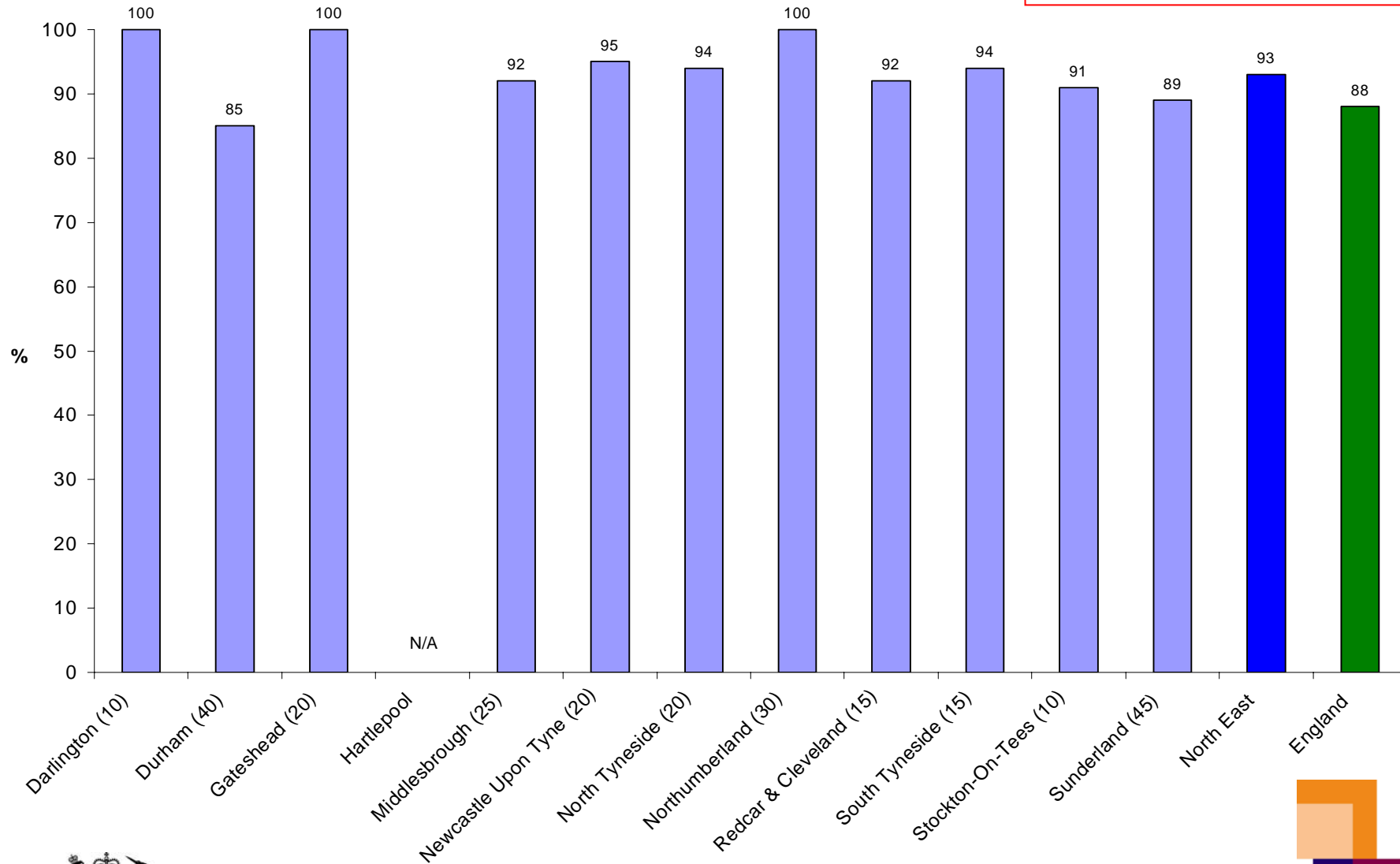


Change over time in the % of offenders in settled and suitable accommodation, 2005/06 - 2006/07



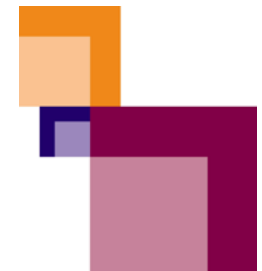
Latest data on the % of care leavers in suitable accommodation, 2005/06*

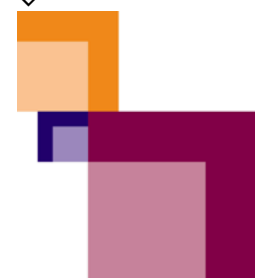
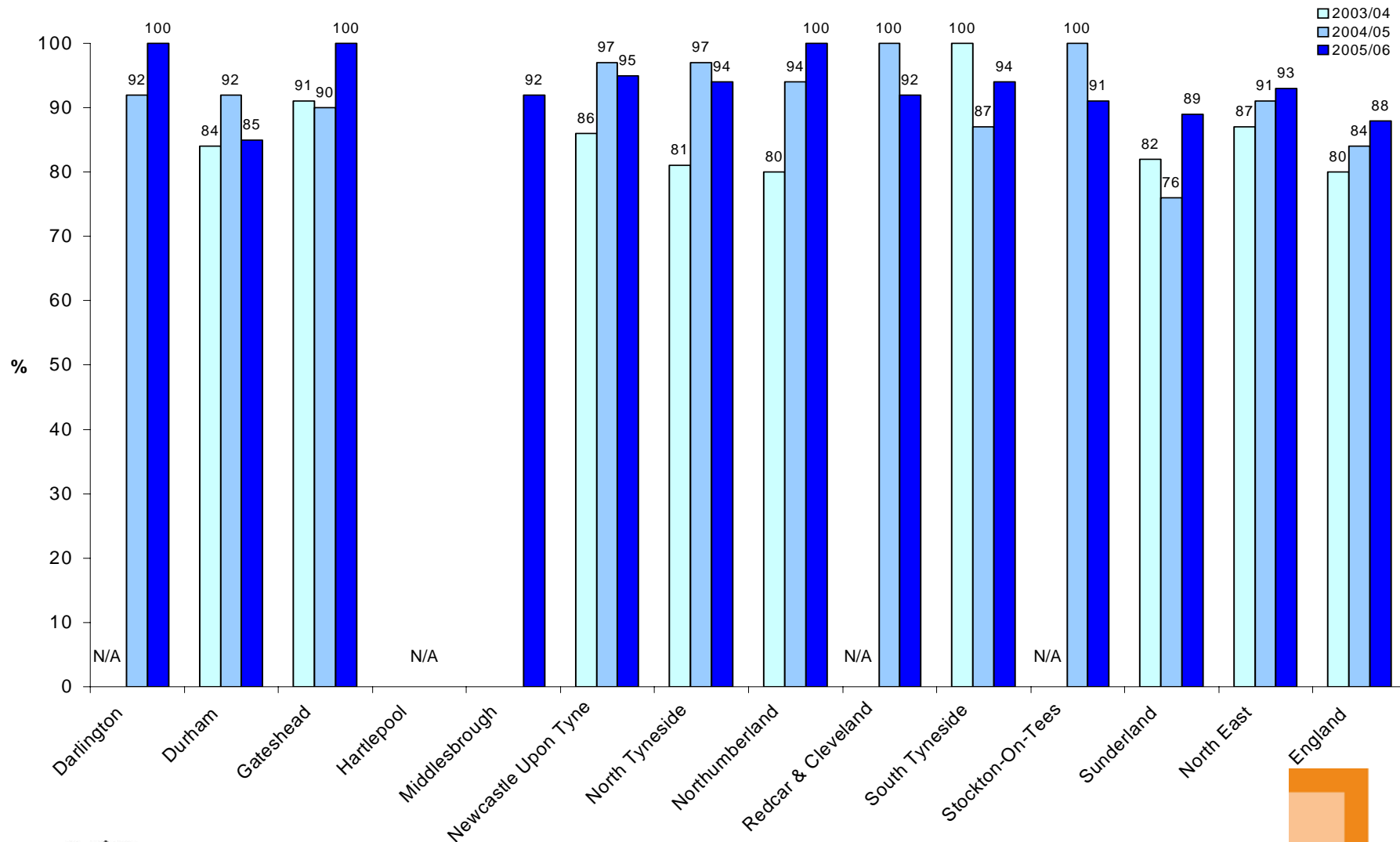

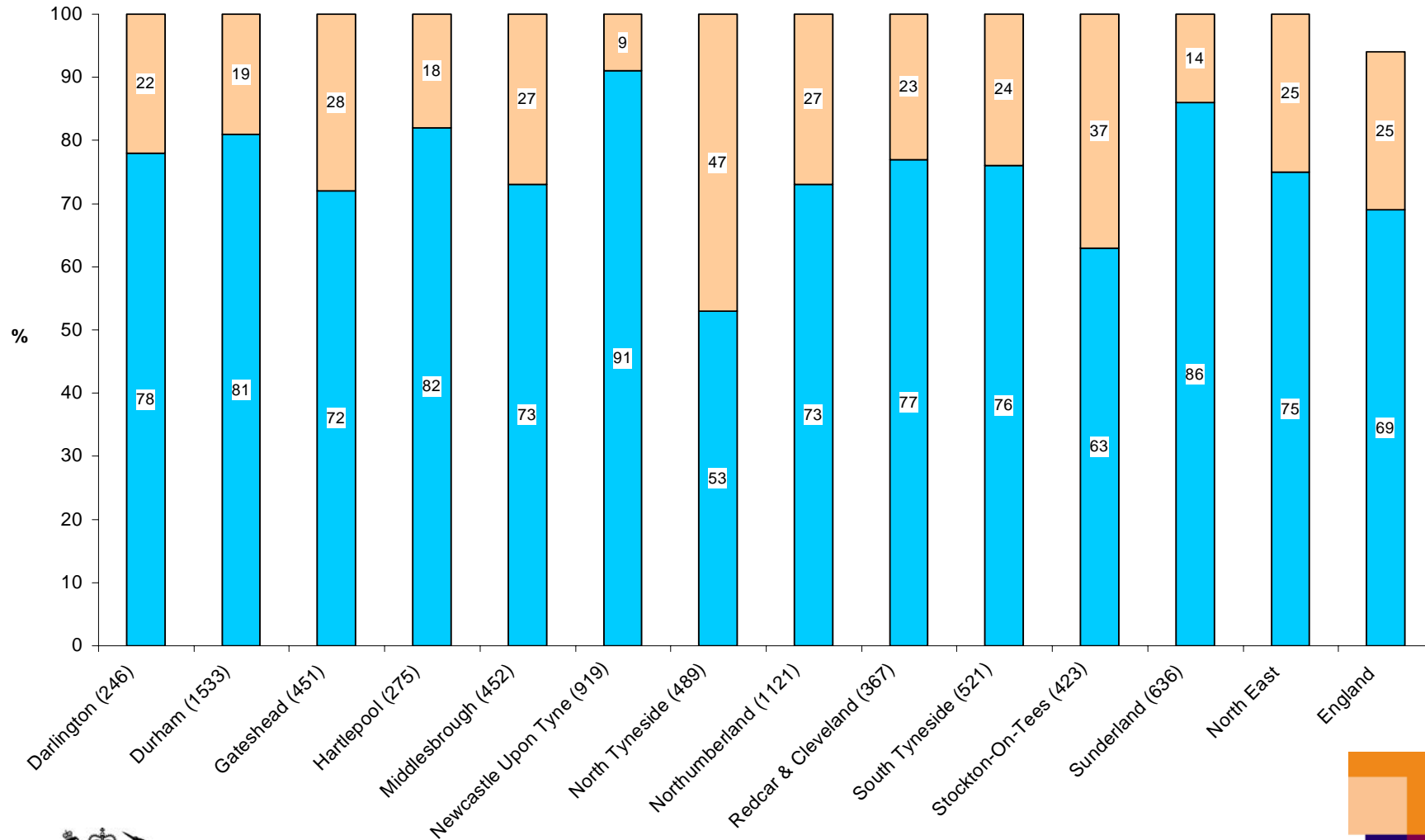
Change over time in the % of care leavers in suitable accommodation, 2003/04 - 2005/06

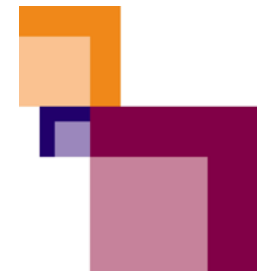
Latest data on the accommodation status of people with learning disabilities who are known to the council, 2005/06*

■ % learning disabled living in community and receiving services

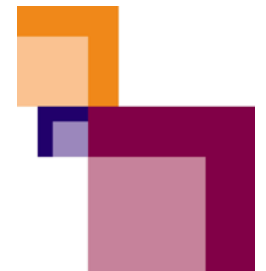

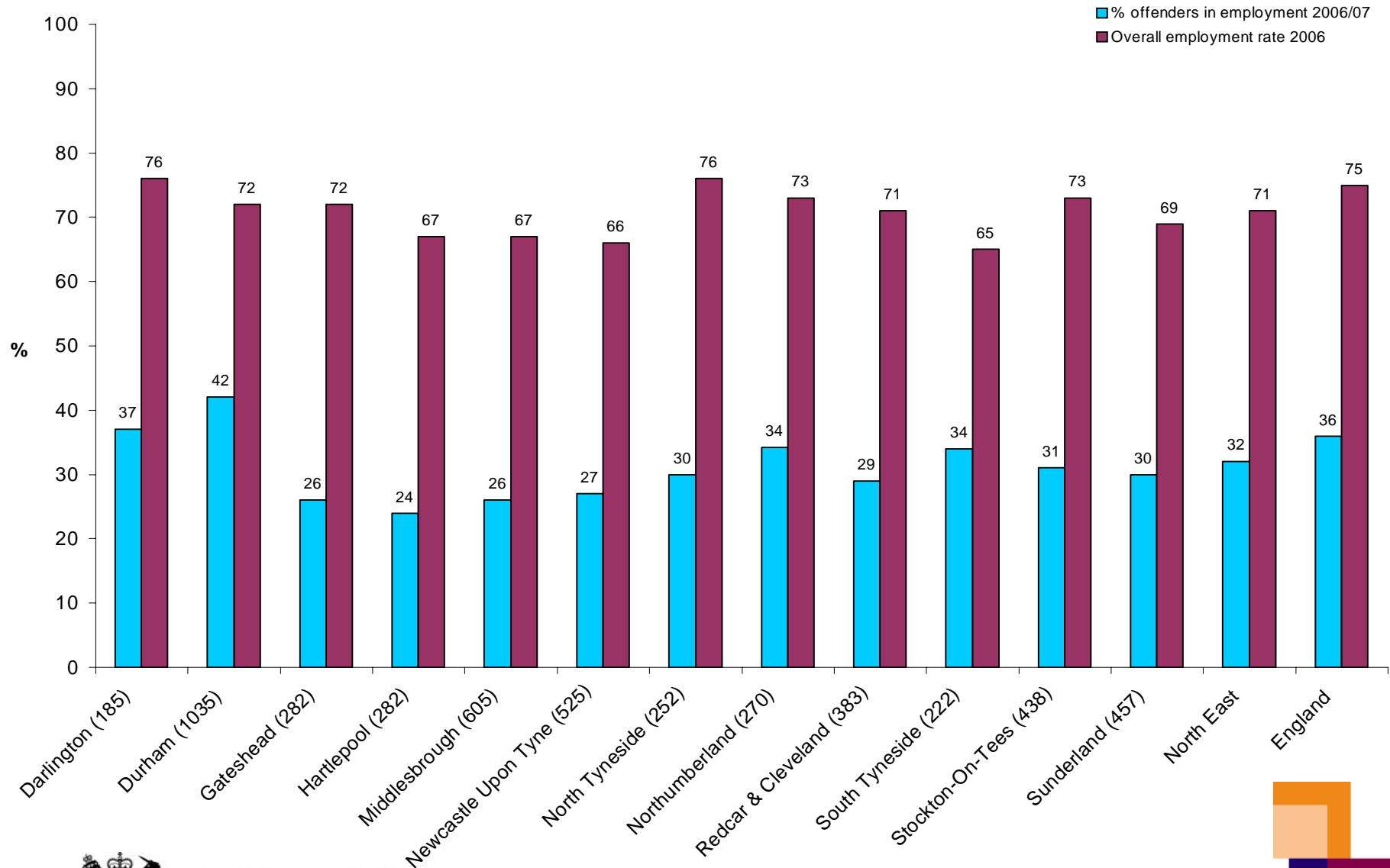

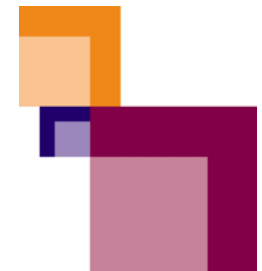

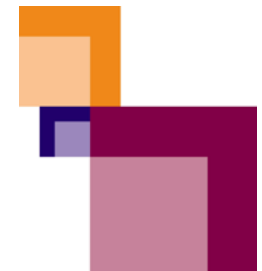
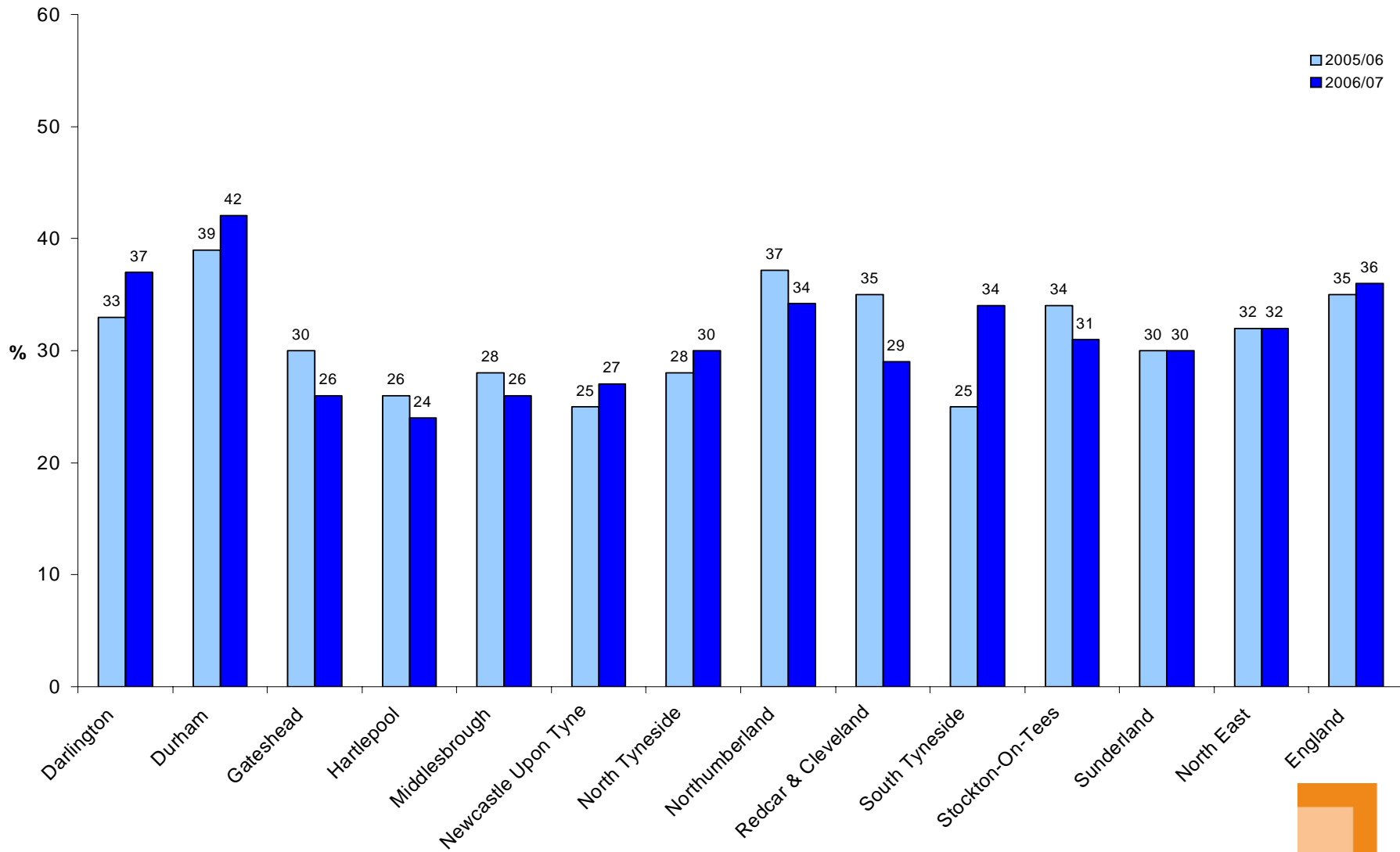
Latest data on the % of offenders in employment, 2006/07*

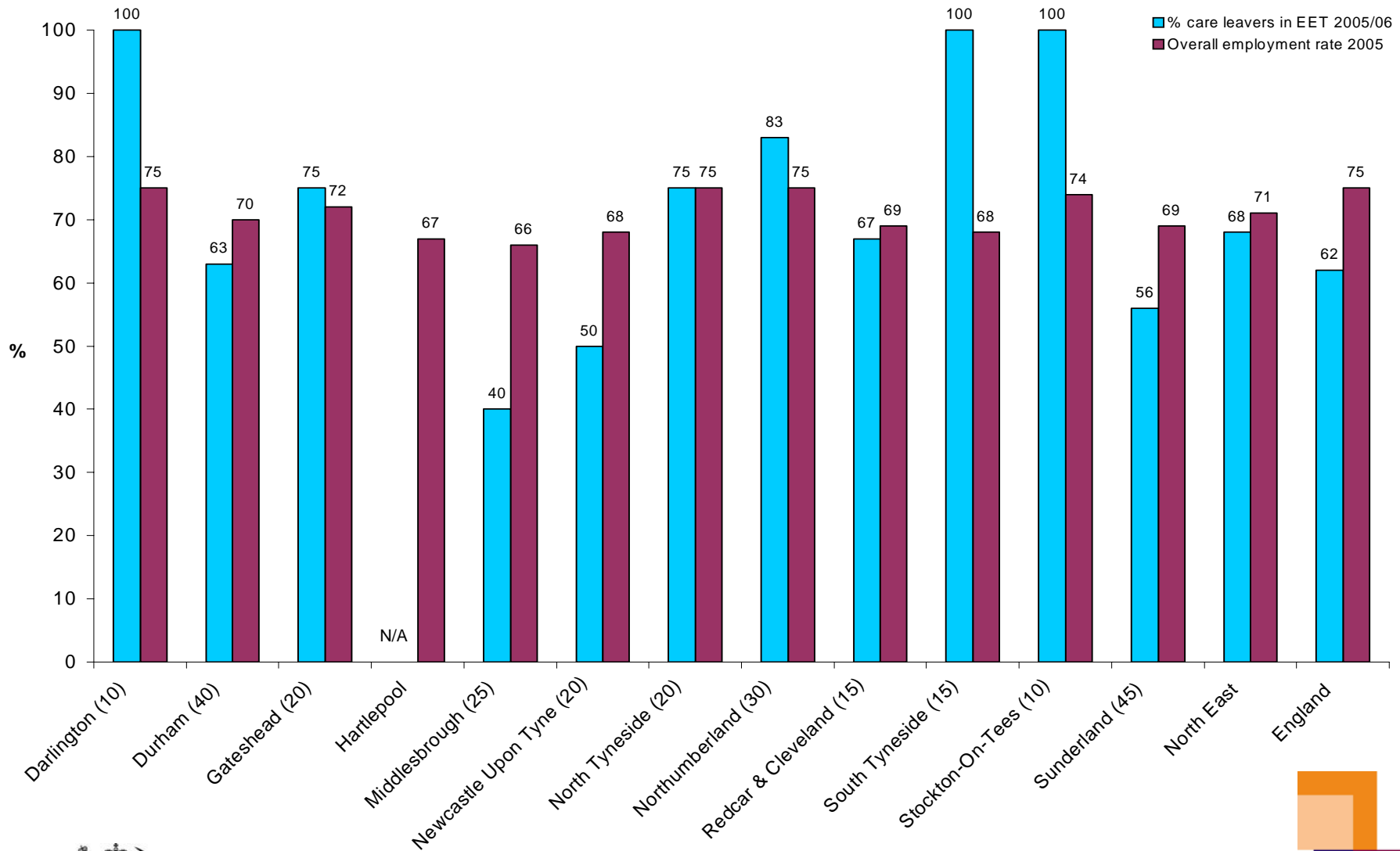


Change over time in the % of offenders in employment, 2005/06 - 2006/07

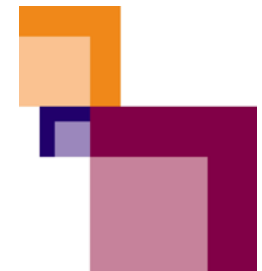


Latest data on the % of care leavers in EET, 2005/06*

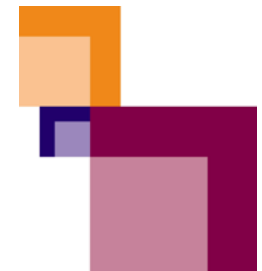
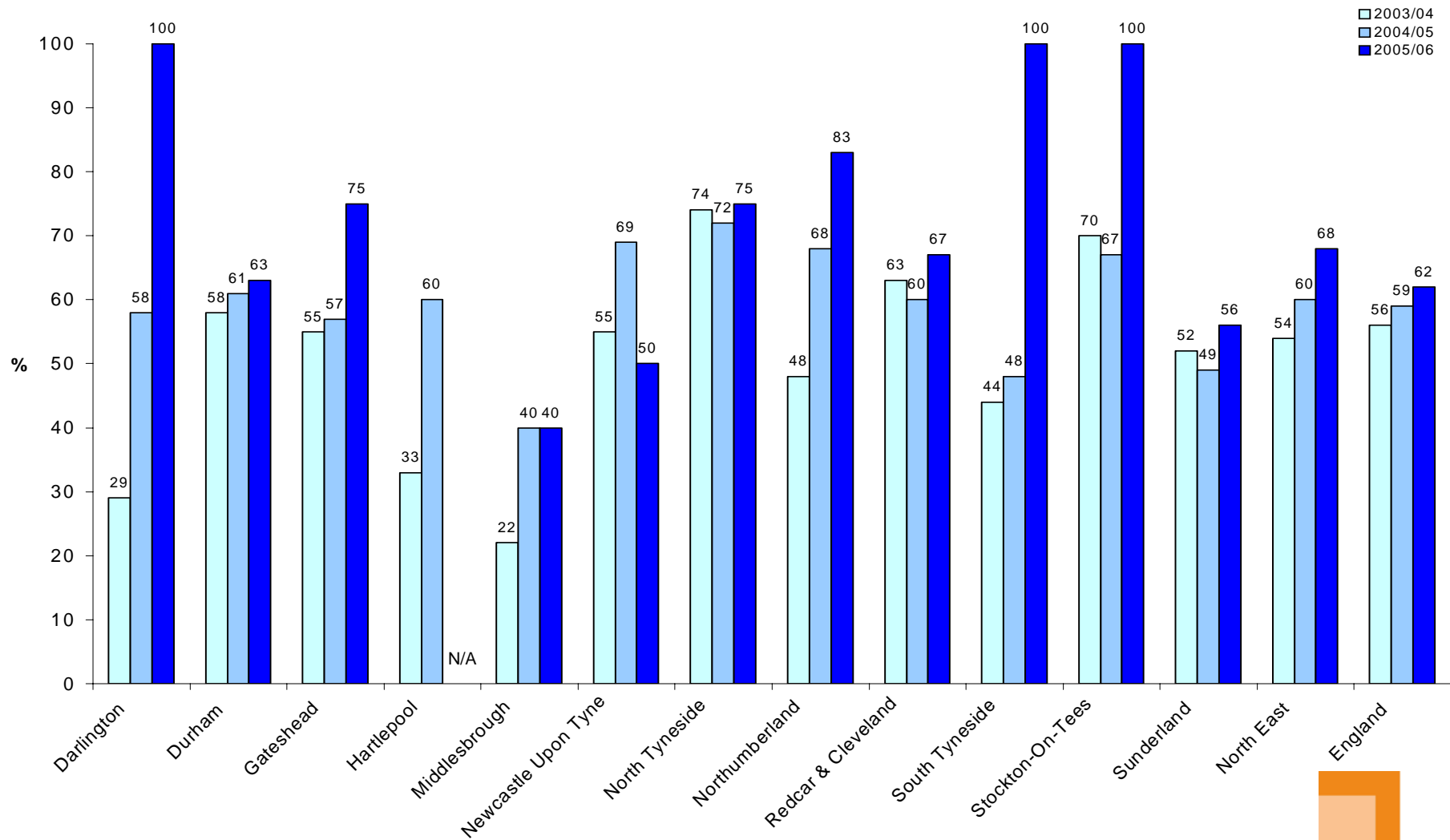

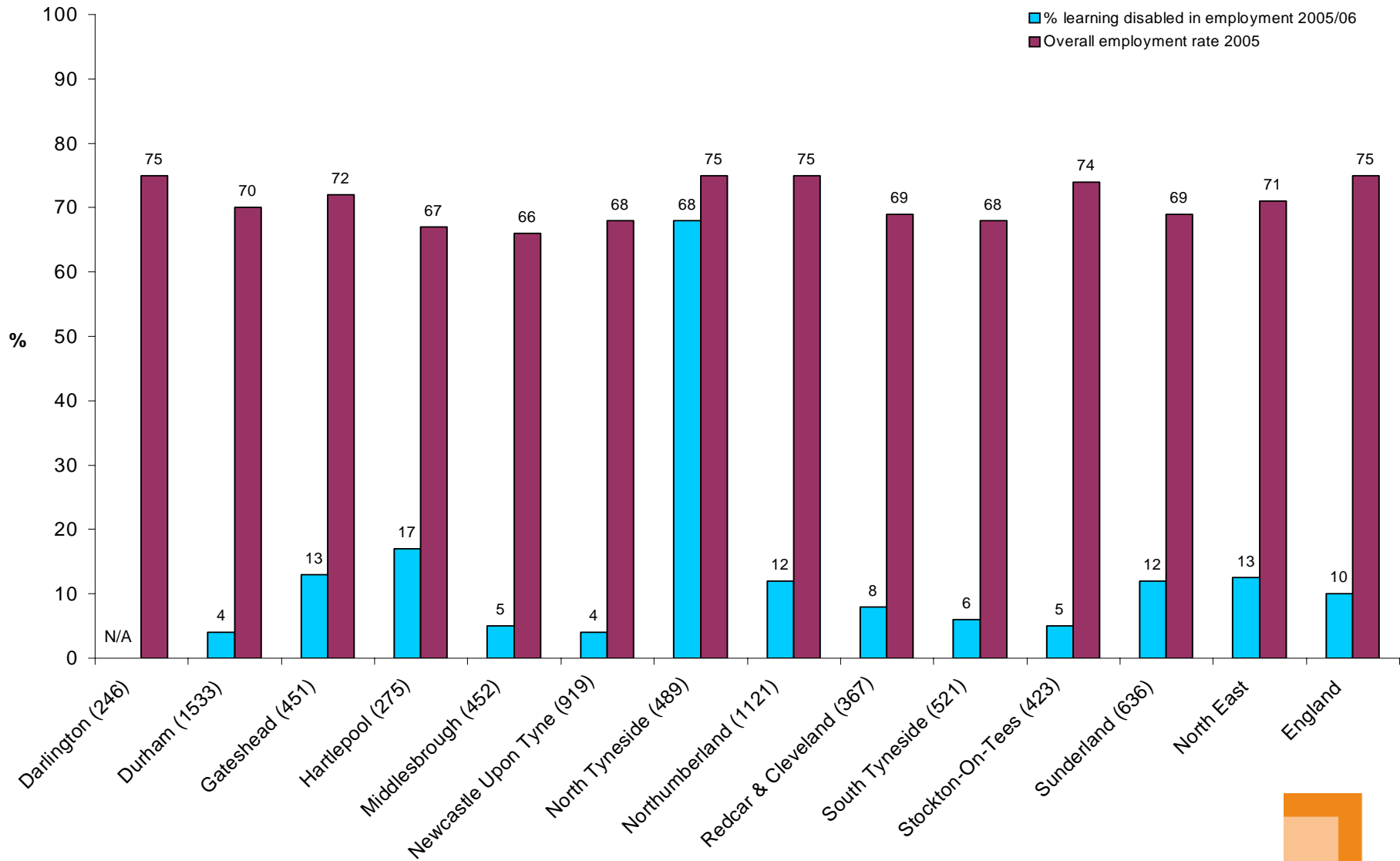


Change over time in the % of care leavers in EET, 2003/04 - 2005/06

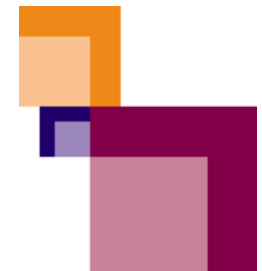

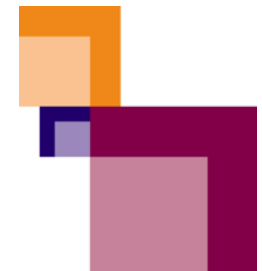
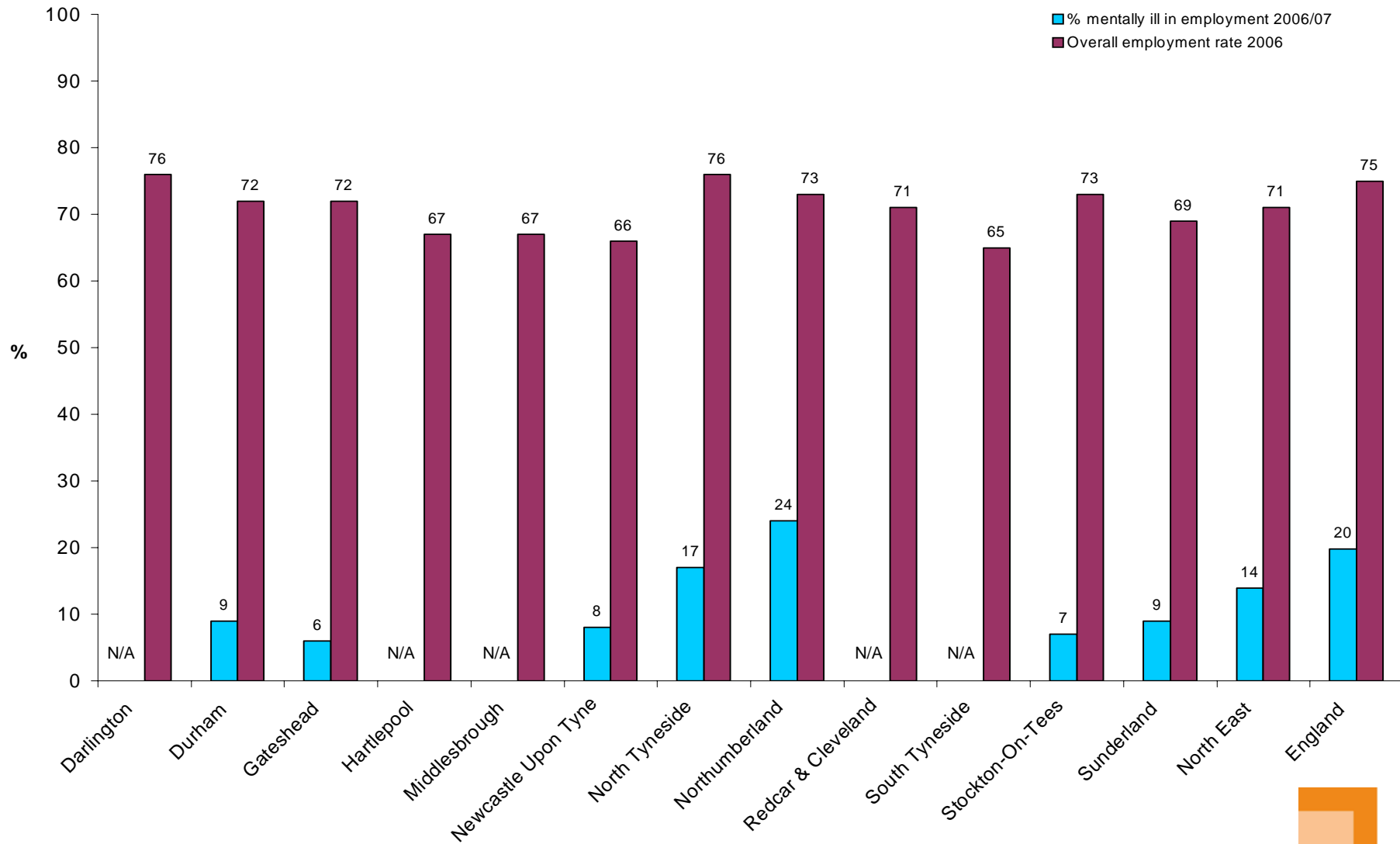
Latest data on the % of learning disabled in employment, 2005/06*
