## INTRODUCTION

Concerns about the discrepancy in funding for services for problem drug users as compared to services for problem alcohol users resulted in a West Sussex Drug Action Team position statement on this matter [see Appendix 1] being made available to all relevant local stakeholders. As part of the efforts to inform the national agenda, which is part of the position statement, the DAT decided that the annual consultation event in 2002 should feed into the National Alcohol Harm Reduction Strategy Consultation process.

The consultation event programme [see Appendix 2] that was held on the 28<sup>th</sup> November was structured in such a way as to ensure that there was maximum potential for all stakeholders to contribute by expressing their views to the consultation questions and thus to this composite response.

The participants to the event represented a diverse range of organisations and occupational groups [see Appendix 3]. The final submission of this document to the strategy unit carries the endorsement of all those stakeholders who attended the event.

The submission does not provide a response to each of the 61 questions in the consultation document but rather provides the composite responses to the 8 thematic areas from which the questions flow.

## THE PRINCIPLES THAT SHOULD UNDERPIN THE STRATEGY

### Questions 1 to 5

There was consensus that as the government benefits in implementing public policy from the revenues raised through alcohol taxation it must have some roles and responsibilities in regard to alcohol misuse. In particular these are:

- Prevention and ensuring that there are education programmes that warn young people of the dangers of alcohol misuse.
- The government should ensure a harmonisation between the drug strategy and any potential alcohol strategy by ensuring that the National Treatment Agency [NTA] is tasked with overseeing the implementation of the strategy.

## THE CULTURAL AND BEHAVIOURAL ISSUES AROUND ALCOHOL USE AND MISUSE

### Questions 6 to 13

- The majority of the adult population use alcohol with little or no harm to themselves, significant others or their communities. Therefore the cultural issue was not *de facto* to reduce the amount of alcohol consumed by this majority but rather to reduce the harmful effects for those whose use of alcohol is problematic.
- There should be efforts made to bring about a change in the well-established pattern of weekend binge drinking particularly by young men. There was no consensus on this but some participants think that if there is a greater relaxation brought about by government in the licensing laws this could contribute to a change in this pattern.
- The problematic use of alcohol for both younger men and women needs to be addressed through more effective education programmes.
- The negative behavioural manifestations associated with the excessive use of alcohol in young cohorts particularly on Friday and Saturday nights with the concomitant violence and disorder present real challenges for which there were no short-term answers. The longer-term solutions are thought to be associated with attitudinal change to be brought about by education and more liberal licensing legislation.

- The positive attributes associated with the use of alcohol and its cultural importance were recognised by the majority of the participants.

## HEALTH: PREVENTION, TREATMENT AND THE IMPACT ON THE NHS

### Questions 14 to 22

- The prevention agenda should be delivered through the personal, health, citizenship and education programmes in schools. The alcohol prevention agenda should continue to be monitored through the young people's substance misuse planning process.
- There is a definite role for various departments in the NHS to ensure both early assessment and intervention. These include primary care, accident and emergency staff, and general nursing and medical staff. There is also a potential training requirement to ensure that these occupational groups feel confident to deal with those whose problems are manifestly associated with excessive alcohol use.
- The Models of Care framework is as relevant for the implementation of alcohol services as it is for drug services. The NTA should have unequivocal responsibility for the alcohol strategy when published and there should be substantial new resource allocation for effective implementation.

- The discrepancy in funding for drug and alcohol services means that there is insufficient resource for alcohol treatment services in spite of the much more significant numbers of problem alcohol users compared to problem drug users.

## **CRIME, DISORDER AND ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR: THE EFFECTS ON OUR SURROUNDINGS AND COMMUNITY**

### Questions 23 to 35

- The crime and disorder audits in the districts and boroughs in West Sussex have all identified the problem use of alcohol as a concern for local citizens. However, the Home Office community against drugs [CAD] allocation does not permit the districts and boroughs to use the money for alcohol related disorder. The Home Office should allow more flexibility with the use of this money in line with local need.
- There was much anecdotal evidence within the experiences of group members to support the view that much needed to be done in particular in relation to the issue of town centre drinking and anti -social behaviour during weekend evenings.

Suggested strategies for this included:

Proactive use of CCTV – although there was mixed opinion as it's effectiveness due to displacement etc



Higher visibility policing

More transport opportunities for home going at closing time – perhaps a late-night transport levy on club admission prices

Broader choice of venues to attract to more mixed population of drinkers and club/pub custom

Better engagement and integration between planners and planning departments and community safety partnerships in creating less problematic town centre environments

## THE IMPLICATIONS FOR VULNERABLE GROUPS

Questions 36 to 40

- The cohorts of young people who are known from research to be vulnerable should already benefit from the targeted education and intervention programmes that are delivered as part of substance misuse prevention and education.
- Those cohorts who are diagnosed with mental health problems but who use or misuse alcohol with negative consequences need to benefit from integrated substance misuse and mental health services.



## EDUCATION AND COMMUNICATION

### Questions 41 to 50

- The need to provide effective education for young people about alcohol and the potential harms was a consistent message of the participants.
- The ability to change attitudes to use of alcohol and driving was acknowledged given that most young people do not drink and drive.
- Information about alcohol needs to be balanced, relevant, truthful and appropriate if it is to be effective. It also needs to be age, gender and culturally specific.

## THE SHAPE OF THE MARKET AND MARKET – BASED SOLUTIONS

### Questions 51 to 55

- The alcohol industry must have a social responsibility in advertising and marketing alcohol beverages particularly those aimed at the younger people's market.



- The government has a role to ensure that the industry exercises this responsibility appropriately and to respond accordingly should it fail to do so.

## THE ECONOMIC COSTS AND BENEFITS OF ALCOHOL

Questions 56 to 61

- The costs, which are associated with the harmful aspects of excessive alcohol use, must be funded through a comprehensive alcohol strategy that addresses prevention, community safety and treatment.

# DISPARITY IN NATIONAL FUNDING ARRANGEMENTS FOR DRUG AND ALCOHOL SERVICES

## A POSITION STATEMENT

In 1998 the government issued their 10 year national strategy for addressing drug related problems, *“Tackling Drugs to Build a Better Britain”*. This strategy has received increasingly generous funding to enable services to meet the challenging directives on treatment waiting times for primary drug referrals.

Under the current spending plans, the pooled budget will continue to provide increasing revenue for the development of drug services and generous allocations have been proposed over the coming years.

The net result of this is that a growing disparity is emerging between services for drugs and alcohol cases. Alcohol treatment has received no specific central government funding in recent years, and despite energetic lobbying of the government by representative organisations and individuals, there is still no published strategy for alcohol treatment and thus no financial investment.

The Prime Ministers Strategy Unit is in the process of forming an Alcohol Project Team (July 2002) that will undertake an extensive consultation with stakeholders to estimate levels of, and response to alcohol related harm. However, this process is unlikely to translate into expanded services in the near future. We are left with

the challenge on managing “combined” services throughout the county, which have, for the most part, made little distinction between drug and alcohol cases and have responded on the basis of clinical risk and priority. The differential funding streams for drugs and alcohol impact awkwardly with this service system and lead to a growing gap which threatens to produce “two tier services” tasked with rapid response to drug referrals at the expense of alcohol referrals for which there are no published target response times.

This situation needs to be acknowledged, understood and managed. Alcohol-related problems are increasing as population consumption increases. It is difficult therefore, to reconcile this clear demand with apparently dwindling supply of services specifically for alcohol. It is an issue, which is keenly, felt by key referring agencies, such as Primary Health care Teams and the Community Mental Health Teams, and if an open and transparent debate is not initiated, may lead to confusion.

The Drug Action Team is seeking to clarify the issue and generate the debate so that all key stakeholders can offer their views and contribute to the process of finding solutions, if only in the interim period until a funded national strategy emerges.

The DAT will want to gather views from as a wide constituency of stakeholders as possible so that views can be sent to the Strategy Unit who are considering this matter.

The DAT has set aside the 28<sup>th</sup> November for a stakeholder event at which the key concerns will be aired and discussed. In the meantime there is an opportunity for any stakeholder to write to the DAT partnership expressing views about the funding for alcohol services. These will be discussed as part of the stakeholder event and will also form part of the composite response to the Prime Ministers Strategy Unit.
