

Ann Limb (Chair)

Ann Limb has spent her career in public service, the latter half leading substantial educational institutions and as Group Chief Executive of the University for Industry (Ufi Ltd), between 2001-2004 spearheaded learndirect and UK online the government's major national e-learning and e-services initiatives. She was Chief Executive, Cambridge Regional College, from 1996-2001 and Chief Executive, Milton Keynes College, from 1989-1996. Ann has experience of working with government ministers and officials, including in the devolved administrations and regional hubs, together with industry, stakeholders and private partners. She is an experienced Chair, holding a number of public sector appointments including the role of Chair of Milton Keynes Partnership, a Committee of the Homes & Communities Agency (CLG) and Non Executive Directorships of HMGCC (FCO) and Milton Keynes Hospital NHS Foundation Trust (DH). Her private sector directorships, include serving on the boards of DRS Data & Research Services plc, a large design and manufacturing company specialising in automated data capture and information processing and Brightyellow Ltd, a next generation broadband wireless internet service provider

Robin Adams

Since 2002 Robin Adams has been Librarian and College Archivist at Trinity College Dublin and was Deputy Librarian there from 1991, having previously held posts in the universities of Cambridge, Glasgow and Queens, Belfast. He holds membership of the Committee on Library Co-operation in Ireland (COLICO), the Legal Deposit Librarians Committee, Research Libraries UK, a Board member of Northern Ireland Publications Resource and the Consortium of University and National Libraries. He is the Chair of Newsplan (Ireland) and a director of Iris Ltd.

Anne Jarvis

Anne Jarvis was appointed University Librarian at Cambridge University Library in April 2009 – the first female to hold the post in its 650 year history. Anne had been Deputy Librarian at Cambridge University Library since 2000. Her main professional interests include emerging information technologies, succession planning, change management and digital preservation. A graduate in history of Trinity College Dublin, Anne's library career began in special libraries and included posts at FÁS, the Training and Employment Authority in Dublin, Ireland, and Coopers and Lybrand in London, England. Her career in academic libraries began at Dublin City University, (DCU) in Ireland. She then moved to Trinity College Dublin where she took up the post of Sub-Librarian, Collection Management, before returning to the UK to take up the Deputy Librarian post at Cambridge. During this period she also served for two years as Vice-President at Wolfson College, where she has been a Fellow since 2000.

Andrew Yeates

Andrew qualified as a solicitor in 1981. He has specialised in copyright and media law since qualifying. Andrew became Intellectual Property Adviser to the PPA and UK Association of Online Publishers in February 2005. He is also currently in-house General Counsel to The Educational Recording Agency. Andrew is also a Consultant with Sheridans Solicitors, dealing with rights management and the exploitation of content on new media platforms. Andrew was Director General of the BPI (British Phonographic Industry), the UK trade association for the record industry, from 2000 – 2004.

Prior to this he worked at Channel 4 for 11 years, holding posts including Head of Acquisitions and Business Affairs, and Head of Rights and Corporation Secretary.

Previous posts included Legal Adviser to Phonographic Performance Limited and Contracts Manager for Thames Television, Thames Television International and Euston Films. Andrew is a Governor of The BRIT School for Performing Arts and Technology. Andrew became a

Director of the British Copyright Council in September 2008.

Trevor Fenwick

Angela Mills Wade

Since 1991 Angela Mills Wade has been the Executive Director of the European Publishers' Council (EPC), a high level lobby group of Chairmen and Chief Executives of major European media corporations whose business interests include newspapers, magazines, journals, books, database and internet publishing as well as in many cases television and radio broadcasting.
