### **Anthea Case appointed as a Commissioner to Commission for Architecture and the Built Environment (CABE)**

Andrew McIntosh, Minister for Heritage and the Media announced today that Anthea Case has been appointed as a Commissioner to CABE. The four year appointment will run from 15 November 2004 to 14 November 2008.

### **Biographical Notes**

Anthea Case is currently Chair of Heritage Link, which represents voluntary bodies in the historic environment. Following a career in HM Treasury, she was Chief Executive of the National Heritage Memorial Fund/Heritage Lottery Fund for nine years until 2002. In 2003, she chaired the judging panel for the EEDA landmark east international design competition. She is currently a member of the Regional Cultural Consortium for the East of England (Living East) and a Community Stakeholder Member of the Regional Assembly as well as a member of the National Trust's East of England Regional Advisory Committee, a trustee of Norwich Heritage and Economic Regeneration Trust and of Lakeland Arts Trust. In 2003 she was awarded a CBE for services to heritage. She has not undertaken any political activity during the last five years.

### **Background**

1. CABE was created in September 1999 as the champion for design quality in buildings, spaces and places across England. Its aim is to stimulate debate and promote the very best of architecture and urban design. Its function is to promote high standards in the design of buildings, as well as their surrounding spaces, and to offer advice to all those who create, manage and utilise the built environment.
2. CABE is funded mainly by the Department for Culture, media and Sport (DCMS) and the Office of the Deputy Prime Minister (ODPM)
3. Remuneration for the post is £5245.
