

Review of UK Intellectual Property Law (the Gowers review)

Response from iansyst Ltd relating to the impact of some IP issues on small businesses and individuals.

1 Executive summary

We believe that in recent years the balance of rights between consumers and IP rights holders has moved too far, in some respects at least, towards the IP rights holders.

We discuss in particular the Newspaper Licensing Agency who we consider to have an attitude and information pack which is unfair and bullying for the smaller organisation. They argue that this is backed up by the law. We argue that this goes beyond the law but that the law itself also goes further than it should in restricting the scope of "fair dealing" in newspaper copyright exceptions. Unless the law is reasonable it will be disregarded and will bring itself into disrepute. We will show that the law, as promulgated by the NLA, is so inconsistent as to be clearly unenforceable.

We also argue that the law is more complicated and expensive than it needs to be if the smaller organisation is to feel that it can benefit from it.

2 Who we are

2.1 iansyst Ltd dyslexic.com

iansyst is a small company of some 55 employees, founded in 1983. It specialises in technology tools to help dyslexic people make the most of their abilities, and has made a separate submission to the Gowers Review with other dyslexia and disability organisations. It makes a living from selling copyright materials (mainly software). It publishes some software and literature and receives a small amount of income from the CLA. The author of this submission, Ian Litterick, founder and Executive Chairman, has in the past received useful income from PLR as an author.

In short we believe strongly in copyright. We particularly value copyright as a form of IP which the smaller person or company can enjoy the benefit of without, normally, having to pay extra.

3 List of recommendations

3.1 Recommendation 1

The CDPA should include a much clearer definition of fair dealing which covers copying of written materials by anyone, whether a commercial organisation or a private individual:

- in small quantities and/or
- for small proportions of the original
- if not done for direct financial gain

It would need to be phrased in such a way to exclude organisations whose raison d'etre is partly to provide copies (e.g. cuttings agencies and libraries).

3.2 Recommendation 2

If fair dealing is to rely on the concept of "non-commercial", as in CDPA Section 29 (1) (the Research exception), then "commercial" should be defined much more precisely as implying direct financial gain.

3.3 Recommendation 3

Collecting agencies, which have government backing, should have an obligation to give objective information making equally clear when licensing is not required.

3.4 Recommendation 4

The collecting agencies including the NLA should publish their accounts on their web sites, including giving information about distributions and collections by category.

3.5 Recommendation 5

The Gower Review bears in mind the reasonable needs of the consumer to enjoy the products of IP that they have paid for, against the louder voice of rights owners.

3.6 Recommendation 6

The Gower Review attempts to lower the cost and complication of IP law such that the smaller organisation and individual can use it.

3.7 Recommendation 7

The UK government should also be pressing for these policies in European Union directives and at WIPO.

4 Discussion

4.1 The NLA and fair dealing

We, along with I presume many, many small organisations, have been approached by the Newspaper Licensing Agency and instructed that we need an NLA licence if we ever copy any articles from their participating newspapers. ("We are systematically contacting all companies and organisations in the UK...").

At risk of infringing NLA's copyright, (!) we attach electronic copies of most of the items from the NLA information pack.

I do not question the existence of the NLA and that there is a reasonable role in collecting royalties from organisations that systematically copy newspaper articles for directly commercial purposes.

Nor is this submission an attack on the NLA. Rather it is using the NLA as an example of where copyright law is being used oppressively and in my opinion unreasonably by powerful copyright owners against ordinary consumers.

However, their terms and all their literature, suggest that if one was ever to make a single photocopy of a single article within a commercial organisation one would need an NLA licence. In our case that would amount to about £260 a year. For the amount of copying that I estimate that we do this would amount to several pounds per copy.

To quote from the NLA's web site . . . "if you see an article you want to copy to someone else, you need the permission of the copyright owner. Until 1996, anyone who wanted, legally, to copy newspapers had to call each newspaper, each time."

But the licence is a nonsense. The explanatory notes say: "The licence does not include a right to copy photographs, illustrations or advertisements appearing in NLA newspapers."

So if there happens to be a photograph in the newspaper cutting about dyslexia that someone helpfully puts up in our office kitchen, we are still breaking the law even if we have an NLA licence. I presume that the NLA think that legally we should go to the publisher of the journal and ask for permission to copy the photograph. Plainly ridiculous. Such use should be fair dealing.

If, on the other hand, it is fair dealing to copy the photograph, it must surely be fair dealing to copy the article.

The explanatory notes also say "The licence does not permit the systematic photocopying or fax copying of more than 250 copies of any one cutting taken from any one issue of a newspaper without the written consent of the NLA."

So even if we invest in an NLA licence, we couldn't, according to this reading, show an image of the newspaper article, at any resolution, in, say, a newsletter that we published. Again, if this is a reduced, not fully legible picture of the article this should be fair dealing.

Or indeed, according to a reading of the *Does your organisation need a NLA licence.doc* attached we would need a licence from the newspaper to copy, whether by transcription, or digitally, part of the contents of the article in such a newsletter. To quote: "Any organisation that copies from newspaper articles needs to have permission from the copyright owner to do so." Please note that there is no qualification at all to this statement. I would argue that it should be fair dealing to copy the content of up to one full article from a newspaper (possibly depending on the length of the article).

Elsewhere, it is unclear whether the NLA licence covers copying the contents of the same article from the newspaper's web site, to use in the same way.

Nowhere does the NLA mention, for example, the possibility that there may be a legitimate exception under CDPA section 30 **Criticism, review and news reporting**, except to say in the (very partial) leaflet *The law on copyright* that the M&S Court of Appeal result "makes it clear that copying of articles will not be excused by being considered to be fair dealing for the purpose of reporting news and current events."

So, according to the NLA's literature, it appears to be an infringement, if you have no NLA licence, to copy anything, from any newspaper article, in any way, ever, if you are in a commercial organisation.

Most of the articles that we might be tempted to copy are actually from specialist special needs or dyslexia journals (and I don't think that there is any collecting agency which covers them). These are not covered by the NLA licence. So even if we have an NLA licence, it is presumably still an infringement if we put a copy on the kitchen noticeboard. I cannot imagine that most journal publishers would be pleased to be asked permission to make such a copy. Clearly this should be fair dealing.

We would normally copy relevant bits of such articles, or the articles themselves, with attribution, but, if the copying is limited, without permission. The attribution takes the place of a royalty as a form of advertising for the publisher and author. This should be fair dealing. If done in a big or systematic way we would get permission. The position with newspapers should be similar.

To some extent, it is irrelevant whether I have interpreted the NLA's documentation correctly or not. The effect of the documentation is to put a considerable amount of pressure on the organisation concerned to register with the NLA for the sake of a quiet time. Indeed, the pressure from the NLA brings to mind the protection racket style bullying and legal threats

from bogus Swiss/Austrian directory scam companies. Tendentious and incomplete information, some very small print, legal threats and discounts for paying up quickly.

Most people reading the NLA's literature will have much less than my very limited knowledge of copyright law. Few will feel able to sign the *Declaration by Company or Other Organisation* which the NLA includes in its pack but have not given us a digital copy of and do not appear to offer on their site. This basically says that we have not copied anything, ever from a newspaper.

At Appendix A. is a copy of correspondence between the NLA and myself. I will not argue about it in detail as this submission is already too long. It argues mainly about how far the law justifies NLA's position and actions.

Who regulates the NLA? As an organisation with quasi statutory powers should it not have an obligation to be extremely objective in the information that it gives? Particularly if it is purporting to give legal information to people who would be expected to have no legal knowledge of the field at all. Nowhere in the NLA's literature can I find the possibility that there might be any valid reason for an organisation ever copying from a newspaper without a licence. From NLA's e-mail of the 20th of April, points 8. and 9. it is clear that there might be. This should be explained in NLA's literature.

NLA didn't answer my question '*Are there any circumstances in which any copying of newspapers within an organisation could still, according to the NLA, be "fair dealing"?*' They seem to regard it as question of guilty until proven innocent:

"...in any given situation it is for the entity which is copying NLA newspapers without a licence to either show proof that every copy it makes falls within a defence under the Act, or to take a licence."

Is it not, on the contrary, for the NLA or the newspaper to sue and prove a tort?

4.2 The smaller organisation as rights holder

Undoubtedly the costs of protecting IP, both in finance and in hassle, mean that an organisation like ours rarely bothers. We have not, for example, protected our trademarks which we have legally been advised to do. We feel that the law of "passing off" will largely protect us. In any case, whether legally registered or not, we would feel that the legal position was largely irrelevant if it came to a battle with a larger organisation with more resources and more lawyers. So we tend to rely more on good sense and good luck.

Dyslexia Action, who joined us in another submission, made the somewhat similar point, which was irrelevant to the submission about disabilities:

Speaking for an organisation (relatively small) which produces resources - could we perhaps get in somewhere that 'consideration for small companies with limited resources should be considered in terms of the expense incurred of: a) meeting the terms of the act and b) protecting its own IP rights.

5 Conclusion

We welcome the Review as an opportunity to review the balance of rights between consumers and rights holders. We trust that you will bear in mind the costs to the consumer end of the smaller organisation of compliance and the externalities which legislation imposes. We trust that you will ensure that ordinary, reasonable, fair behaviour will be allowed by IP legislation rather than becoming a theoretical infringement.

We suspect that the review will get many submissions from those who own Intellectual Property and have an interests in strengthening their control over its ownership. Owners know the value of IP, and know the law and how it relates to them. We trust you will also give due weight to the voice of the consumer and the smaller organisation. These are less likely to know the law, less likely to know of the Review and so much less likely to make sure that their voice is heard by you.

Dear Ian

Thank you for your email.

The Copyright and Related Rights Regulations 2003. (CRRR) is an EU directive that is an amendment to the existing legislation, namely the Copyright, Designs and Patents Act, 1988 (CDPA).

Section 29(1) of the CPDA allows an individual to make a single copy of a cutting for the purpose of research and private study. The intention of this provision has always been to allow someone to copy during his or her own self-study and personal development, and has never extended to copies made in the work place during the course of someone's work.

The amendment brought into effect by the CRRR backs up this position by adding the word non-commercial. It is not a change in the copyright law, merely a clarification that backs up the stance taken by collecting societies, such as the NLA.

I hope this clarifies the matter, please do not hesitate to contact me with any further queries.

Dear Emma

I suggest that you pass this on to your legal people. I am making a representation to the Gower review on the subject, which has to be in by the end of this week, so it would be very helpful if I could have their comments by return. I'm sorry not to have given you more time, but the deadline snuck up on me.

You say:

"The intention of this provision has always been to allow someone to copy during his or her own self-study and personal development, and has never extended to copies made in the work place during the course of someone's work."

Whose intention? The legislators? Or the copyright holders?

The concept of "fair dealing" is long established and I do not recall it being abolished. It would traditionally, as I understand it, allow copying for review or quoting purposes of small parts of

a printed work without the permission of the copyright holder. This would traditionally have included one article in a journal or newspaper as long as it was a small part of the whole.

I assume that your request is justified by and follows from the Copyright and Related Rights Regulations 2003 (SI 2003 No. 2498). This introduced the concept of "non-commercial" -- I presume because it wanted to catch organisations like cutting agencies who make a living from reproducing other people's copyright material. It is clear from your literature that you use a very restricted interpretation of the words 'non-commercial'. Could you please tell me where, in statute or in case law, you get this interpretation of 'non-commercial' from?"

Until 2003 there was little doubt that any copying of newspapers that we ever do would have been justified as "fair dealing". The 2003 regulations represented a major shift in the balance of rights to copyright holders as against media users -- to my mind undesirably -- by introducing the "non-commercial" criterion to copyright exceptions. The NLA have used this as an excuse for setting up a huge bureaucracy for levying a tithe on Uncle Tom Cobbleigh and all, as well as on those whose business is copying, and who should reasonably be contributing for the privilege. For want of evidence to the contrary, I would maintain that any copying that we might do is "non-commercial", but that doesn't mean that I could sign the NLA's declaration. Hence my asking for the justification for their interpretation.

My interpretation of the word "non-commercial" would be in terms of making money directly from the copying activity, or having copying as part of one's *raison d'être* (as, for example, in a library). The following, which I only just happen to have come across, reflects a much more normal definition of the word "non-commercial".

"Picasa Software is made available to you for your non-commercial use only. This means that you may use it at work or at home, but you first need to obtain Google's permission if you want to sell the Picasa Software or any information, services, or software associated with or derived from the Picasa Software, or if you want to modify, copy (except as explicitly provided below), license, or create derivative works from the Picasa Software (collectively, "Commercial Use")."

To summarise the questions:

- 1) Where, in statute or in case law, do you get this interpretation of "non-commercial" that justifies the statement : "Any organisation that copies from newspaper articles needs to have permission from the copyright owner to do so." (quoted from NLA *Does your organisation need a NLA licence.doc*) or justifies at the statement that ". . . ever having made copies for internal use . . . just occasionally ad hoc " could not be fair dealing? (NLA *Declaration by company or other organisation* that does not want to subscribe to the NLA's service.)
- 2) Are there any circumstances in which any copying of newspapers within an organisation could still, according to the NLA, be "fair dealing"?

I should add that I have no objection in principle to the collecting agencies, and have received money from them both as publisher and author.

Thank you for your email.

You have raised a number of issues which I will answer in turn.

1. As a general point, you seem to be asking a number of vague questions about defences to copyright infringement. The starting point is that if you copy NLA newspapers without a licence, there is a presumption that you have infringed copyright. The burden is then on you to establish, as a matter of law and evidence, that you have a defence to such a claim in relation to each and every act of copying. Nothing which you have said suggests you do have such a defence. Nonetheless, as a gesture of goodwill, we have taken the trouble to respond (and have incurred legal fees through doing so) to the queries you raised.

2. In response to your question about the statement in our e-mail of 17 February about the intention of section 29(1) of the Copyright Designs and Patents Act 1988 ("the Act"), I confirm that we were talking about the legislators' intention in framing the provision.

3. You say the concept of fair dealing "is long-established" and has not been abolished, and that it "would traditionally... allow copying for review or quoting purposes of small parts of a printed work without the permission of the copyright holder". This is incorrect. There is no defence of "fair dealing" as such. Rather, there are defences such as section 29(1), of which "fair dealing" is one of the elements. For example, to successfully establish a defence under s29(1), you would have to show that (i) you were using the work for the purposes of research, (ii) the research was for a non-commercial purpose, (iii) your use amounted to "fair dealing", and (iv) you had made a sufficient acknowledgement. So "fair dealing" in fact acts to narrow the scope of the defence.

4. The amendment to s29(1) was made so as to render English law compliant with the EU Information Society Directive (2001/29, Arts 5(3)(a), (4)), which was implemented in the UK by the Copyright and Related Rights Regulations 2003. You will of course appreciate that there is no point in us or our lawyers spending time commenting to you on the philosophical rights or wrongs of this change.

5. You say "Until 2003 there was little doubt that any copying of newspapers that we ever do would have been justified as "fair dealing", and "For want of evidence to the contrary, I would maintain that any copying that we might do is "non-commercial"". As noted above, there is no general defence of "fair dealing". It is (now as pre-2003) for you to establish by providing us with evidence that your copying falls within the defence of a defence provided for by the Act.

6. Your suggested interpretation of "non-commercial" in s29(1) as "making money from the copying activity" is incorrect. To qualify for the defence, the copying must be (aside from the other requirements set out above) "for the purposes of research for a non-commercial purpose". So it is clear on the face of the statute that it is not the

copying, but the research for which the copying is done, which must be for a non-commercial purpose. There is as yet no case-law on the meaning of "for a non-commercial purpose" under section 29(1). The leading textbook on the subject of copyright, Copinger and Skone James, states (2005 Edn, para 9-28) "Presumably any research which, at the time it is conducted, is contemplated or intended should be ultimately used for a purpose which has some commercial value will not be within the permitted act". It is therefore widely recognised (not least by the NLA's thousands of existing licensees, the majority of which are not cuttings agencies) that "non-commercial" has a wide meaning.

7. We're not really sure what point you are making in quoting from the terms of business of Picasa Software/ Google. This obviously has no relevance whatsoever to how the English courts would interpret the Act. But in any event, the terms of that clause were very narrow. They only allowed *use* of the software, and not any *copying* without permission ("you first need to obtain Google's permission if you want to ... copy ...works from the Picasa Software").

8. As to your first question at the end of your email, see our comments above as to how "non-commercial" would be interpreted by the English courts. The NLA declaration from which you quote is for entities that do not make copies of NLA newspapers. For those who have copied but claim that they fall within one of the defences, as explained above, it is for that entity to prove they fall within the defence, by providing evidence.

9. As to your second question, as mentioned above, there is no general defence of "fair dealing". Rather, "fair dealing" is a concept which forms part of certain defences under the Act. As also explained above, in any given situation it is for the entity which is copying NLA newspapers without a licence to either show proof that every copy it makes falls within a defence under the Act, or to take a licence.

I hope this answers the questions that you have. Please be advised that we have spent resources referring your questions to our solicitors, so we would appreciate a prompt response from you outlining exactly what copying has taken place within your organisation so we can establish your licensing requirements.

A preprint of my "Strong Copyright + DRM + Weak Net Neutrality = Digital Dystopia?" paper is now available.

This quote from the paper's conclusion sums it up:

What this paper has said is simply this: three issues--a dramatic expansion of the scope, duration, and punitive nature of copyright laws; the ability of DRM to lock-down content in an unprecedented fashion; and the erosion of Net neutrality--bear careful scrutiny by those who believe that the Internet has fostered (and will continue to foster) a digital revolution that has resulted in an extraordinary explosion of innovation, creativity, and information dissemination. These issues may well determine whether the much-touted "information superhighway" lives up to its promise or simply becomes the "information toll road" of the future, ironically resembling the pre-Internet online services of the past.

For those who want a longer preview of the paper, here's the introduction:

Blogs. Digital photo and video sharing. Podcasts. Rip/Mix/Burn. Tagging. Vlogs.

Wikis. These buzzwords point to a fundamental social change fueled by cheap PCs and servers, the Internet and its local wired/wireless feeder networks, and powerful, low-cost software: citizens have morphed from passive media consumers to digital media producers and publishers.

Libraries and scholars have their own set of buzz words: digital libraries, digital presses, e-prints, institutional repositories, and open access journals to name a few. They connote the same kind of change: a democratization of publishing and media production using digital technology.

It appears that we are on the brink of an exciting new era of Internet innovation: a kind of digital utopia. Dr. Gary Flake of Microsoft has provided one striking vision of what could be (with a commercial twist) in a presentation entitled "How I Learned to Stop Worrying and Love the Imminent Internet Singularity," and there are many other visions of possible future Internet advances.

When did this metamorphosis begin? It depends on who you ask. Let's say the late 1980's, when the Internet began to get serious traction and an early flowering of noncommercial digital publishing occurred.

In the subsequent twenty-odd years, publishing and media production went from being highly centralized, capital-intensive analog activities with limited and well-defined distribution channels to being diffuse, relatively low-cost digital activities with the global Internet as their distribution medium. Not to say that print and conventional media are dead, of course, but it is clear that their era of dominance is waning. The future is digital.

Nor is it to say that entertainment companies (e.g., film, music, radio, and television companies) and information companies (e.g., book, database, and serial publishers) have ceded the digital content battlefield to the upstarts. Quite the contrary.

High-quality thousand-page-per-volume scientific journals and Hollywood blockbusters cannot be produced for pennies, even with digital wizardry. Information and entertainment companies still have an important role to play, and, even if they didn't, they hold the copyrights to a significant chunk of our cultural heritage.

Entertainment and information companies have understood for some time that they must adopt to the digital environment or die, but this change has not always been easy, especially when it involves concocting and embracing new business models. Nonetheless, they intend to thrive and prosper--and to do whatever it takes to succeed. As they should, since they have an obligation to their shareholders to do so.

The thing about the future is that it is rooted in the past. Culture, even digital culture, builds on what has gone before. Unconstrained access to past works helps determine the richness of future works. Inversely, when past works are inaccessible except to a privileged minority, it impoverishes future works.

This brings us to a second trend that stands in opposition to the first. Put simply, it is the view that intellectual works are "property"; that this property should be protected with the full force of civil and criminal law; that creators have perpetual, transferable property rights; and that contracts, rather than copyright law, should govern the use of intellectual works.

A third trend is also at play: the growing use of Digital Rights Management

(DRM) technologies. When intellectual works were in paper form (or other tangible forms), they could only be controlled at the object-ownership or object-access levels (a library controlling the circulation of a copy of a book is an example of the second case). Physical possession of a work, such as a book, meant that the user had full use of it (e.g., the user could read the entire book and photocopy pages from it). When works are in digital form and they are protected by some types of DRM, this may no longer be true. For example, a user may only be able to view a single chapter from a DRM-protected e-book and may not be able to print it.

The fourth and final trend deals with how the Internet functions at its most fundamental level. The Internet was designed to be content, application, and hardware "neutral." As long as certain standards were met, the network did not discriminate. One type of content was not given preferential delivery speed over another. One type of content was not charged for delivery while another wasn't. One type of content was not blocked (at least by the network) while another wasn't. In recent years, "network neutrality" has come under attack.

The collision of these trends has begun in courts, legislatures, and the marketplace. It is far from over. As we shall see, its outcome will determine what the future of digital culture looks like.

 - for public relations consultancies and trade or professional associations the right to undertake any of the types of copying above subject to specific conditions set out below.
- 2.2 Subject to the payment of an indemnity fee for past copying, an indemnity (under the same terms of the licence) is also granted in respect of past copying that has taken place before the Commencement Date.
- 2.3 The licence and indemnity is also granted to subsidiary companies and associated companies of the licensee incorporated within the United Kingdom. The licensee is asked to provide details of these in the application form.
- 2.4 Provided the terms of the licence are complied with, the NLA gives an indemnity for damages and reasonable legal costs incurred as a result of the licensee having made and used copies in accordance with the licence. This is subject to the licensee invoking this indemnity in giving notice to the NLA within fourteen days of its receiving notice of any claim. A licensee may defend at its own cost, provided that it keeps the NLA informed of the steps that it takes.
- 3 Limitations to the licence**
3.1 The licence is limited to copying and circulation of cuttings from NLA newspapers taking place within the licensee's premises in the United Kingdom (including the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man) and in those countries in which the NLA does not have a licence agreement with a foreign collecting society or publisher. However, a licensee may send copies of cuttings to its foreign parent company, subsidiaries and associated companies, provided that it applies for this right. In this situation the basic licence fee is calculated on the company's worldwide headcount.
- 3.2 The licence is limited to copying and circulation of cuttings from NLA newspapers set out in paragraphs 2.1 and the special conditions in paragraphs 8, 9, 10 and 11 below.
- 3.3 The licence does not include a right to copy photographs, illustrations or advertisements appearing in NLA newspapers.
- 3.4 The licence does not permit the systematic photocopying or fax copying of more than 250 copies of any one cutting taken from any one issue of a newspaper, without the written consent of the NLA.
- 4 The licensee's, subsidiaries' and associated companies' obligations**
4.1 To pay the licence fees referred to in section 6 below.
- 4.2 To pay the indemnity fee for past copying unless the licensee establishes that the indemnity is not required because there has been no past copying.
- 4.3 To use best endeavours to ensure that copies of cuttings made by and/or distributed to personnel of subsidiaries and associated companies are used only for internal use and other purposes provided for in the licence
- 4.3.1 To notify personnel of, and use best endeavours to ensure their compliance with, the provisions of the licence.
- 4.3.2 To use best endeavours to ensure to display adjacent to every copying machine used to make copies, and every scanner used to produce digital copies, any user guidelines which the NLA may from time to time supply to the licensee.
- 4.4 To use best endeavours to ensure that each copy or collation of copies made as part of the licensee's regular clippings service include the notice: "NLA licensed copy. No further copies may be made except under licence".
- 4.5 To make accurate and true statements in applying for the licence.
- 4.6 To keep records of cuttings made and to comply with the auditing obligations as set out in the Price List which sets out the NLA's current tariff.
- 4.7 To supply, upon request, a single copy of each cutting made as part of the auditing obligation, to allow the NLA to facilitate the distribution of royalties.
- 4.8 To renew the licence at the start of each 12-month period in which copying is intended. Failure to renew the licence may result in unlawful copying.
- 4.9 To provide to the NLA within 30 days after it is requested a certificate signed by a mutually approved professional confirming that the licensee has complied with the terms of its licence.
- 4.10 Not to assign or sublicense the licence without the prior written consent of the NLA.
- 4.11 To accept that the NLA is under no liability for the contents of any newspapers copied under the licence.
- 5 Length of the licence**
The licence begins on the Commencement Date. The licence lasts for 12 months but is renewable for further 12-month periods subject to the licensee paying the fee due not later than 35 days after each anniversary of the Commencement Date. Failure to make the payment by this date constitutes a material breach of the licence.
- 6 Fee for the licence**
6.1 The fee, which may have several components depending upon the types of copying you undertake, payable upon the grant of the licence is in two parts; a fee for the indemnity in respect of past copying and a fee for the 12-month period from the Commencement Date. The indemnity fee and the first annual fee are calculated in accordance with the NLA's current tariff set out in the Price List.
- 6.2 The fee for the licence after the first 12-month period is calculated in accordance with the NLA's tariff then in force.
- 6.3 The NLA will send a renewal form approx. 10 weeks before the end of each 12-month period to the licensee for its completion and return. The NLA will then submit a renewal invoice for the renewal fee and VAT due.
- 6.4 In the event that the renewal form is not returned by the licensee (by the end of the 12-month period prior to renewal), the NLA will submit a renewal invoice based upon the previous year's copying, the current tariff and reasonable assumptions as to the levels of copying.
- 6.5 Invoices issued by the NLA for all fees are payable within 30 days after issue. The NLA is entitled to interest upon overdue amounts of 4% above the Bank of England base rate.
- 7 Termination of the licence**
7.1 Either party may terminate the licence by 1 month's written notice given to the other. Provided all sums due from the licensee have been paid, the NLA will reimburse the licensee with any unused proportion of the licence fee on a pro rata basis less an administrative charge of £75 plus VAT.
- 7.2 If the licensee commits any material breach of any of the provisions of the licence and remains in breach fourteen (14) days after receiving notice to remedy such breach then the NLA may by notice terminate the licence. Under these circumstances a refund may not be due.
- 8 Registered Charities**
Any Registered Charity or member of the Charities Institute in Scotland (other than universities, colleges/institutes of further and/or higher education or any organisation whose primary purpose is other than the management of a charitable fund for which it may have registered) may apply for a discount equivalent to our minimum Basic fee.
- 9 Specific conditions applying to digital rights**
9.1 A Digital copying fee, which is payable in addition to the licence fee, is calculated in accordance with the current tariff set out in the Price List.
- 9.2 NLA newspapers marked with "ND" in the UK & Foreign Newspaper List may not be digitally copied.
- 9.3 NLA newspapers' cuttings must be permanently deleted from digital systems within 7 days from scanning. Digital copies of NLA newspapers' cuttings from a press cuttings agency, public relations consultancy or trade or professional association must be deleted within 7 days of receipt.
- 9.4 Each recipient of a licensee's digital cuttings service may make a single hard copy of each cutting from NLA newspapers delivered to them for their own use in the course of their work.
- 9.5 A licensee that is a client of a press cuttings agency or public relations consultancy or a member of a trade or professional association is entitled to make a single hard copy of each digital cutting from NLA newspapers delivered to it. If the same cutting is delivered to several employees of the licensee, each employee may print off a single copy.
- 9.6 A licensee may print off multiple copies or may make multiple photocopies of digital cuttings from NLA newspapers for systematic distribution as long as the licensee complies with the auditing obligations set out in the Price List.
- 10 Public Relations Consultancies and Trade or Professional Associations**
10.1 Any of the above such organisations may make and/or supply photocopies, fax and email copies of cuttings to their clients, subject to the conditions set out in the Price List. However, the right does not extend to certain titles marked "ND" in the UK & Foreign Newspaper List in respect of digital copying. Clients that wish to reproduce the cuttings they receive will need to obtain a licence directly from the NLA.
- 10.2 PR consultancies and trade or professional associations must, once a year, on or before the anniversary of the Commencement Date provide names, addresses (postal and email), telephone numbers and fax numbers of each client and the name of a client contact for which it makes and supplies copies of cuttings, along with details of the copying for each client.
- 10.3 PR consultancies and trade or professional associations must ensure that each copy or collation of copies made for supply to clients/members include the notice: "NLA licensed copy. No further copies may be made except under licence".
- 11 Statutory Rights**
This licence shall be deemed to complement and extend the rights of the licensee under the Copyright, Designs & Patents Act 1988 and the Copyright (Visually Impaired Persons) Act 2002 and nothing in this licence shall constitute a waiver of any statutory rights held by the licensee from time to time under these Acts or any amending legislation.
- 12 Other matters**
12.1 *Waiver*
If the NLA waives, acquiesces or delays in enforcing any breach of the licence this shall not be held against it in relation to later breaches.
- 12.2 *Entire Agreement*
The licence together with the documents referred to in the licence including the fee tariff leaflet and list of newspapers set out the full terms of the agreement between the licensee and the NLA and may not be amended except in writing and signed by the NLA and the licensee.
- 13 Proper Law**
The licence is governed by the laws of and subject to the jurisdiction of the courts in that part of the United Kingdom (England and Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland) in which the licensee has its principal place of business. The licence may also be governed by the laws of and subject to the jurisdiction of the courts of Jersey, Guernsey and the Isle of Man for licensees whose principal place of business is in Jersey, Guernsey and the Isle of Man respectively.

Guidance Notes

The Newspaper Licensing Agency (NLA) is authorised by newspaper publishers to licence the copying of newspapers and is constituted as a Collecting Society under the terms of the Copyright Designs & Patents Act 1988. Every organisation that copies newspaper cuttings needs to be licensed as a protection against copyright infringement. These notes are intended as a guide to assist with the completion of this form and the supporting documentation that may be required.

1. Basic Licence (To be completed by all applicants)

Every licensee must be covered for occasional, ad hoc, copying and the basic licence is required by **all** applicants. The basic licence covers the whole organisation (or group) to make ad hoc photocopies/faxes from national daily papers (Times, Guardian, Daily Express etc.) without the need to keep records about what is copied and when.

2. Supplemental Titles

In addition to cover for national titles, licensees may need to take ad hoc cover for their local/regional newspapers and foreign/miscellaneous newspapers, known as Supplemental Titles. A separate form, titled *UK & Foreign Newspaper List* should be completed giving details of all the additional titles you need cover for. An additional fee is payable per title per year and details of the fees can be found on the *Price List*.

3. Systematic Copying

Many organisations copy newspaper cuttings on a regular or 'systematic' basis. Typically this would include producing daily, weekly or monthly digests of press cuttings that are distributed to staff. If your organisation systematically copies, you must complete and return an *Audit Sheet* providing details of the number of cuttings (each cutting being a separate article) taken from each newspaper over a 2 week audit period and the number of sets you make of those cuttings.

The fee due is calculated by multiplying the number of cuttings by the number of sets to give a total number of copies made in the 2-week audit period. This is then used to estimate the total annual number of copies made by your organisation, which is then charged at a price per copy (see *Price List* for details) to arrive at the annual fee for systematic copying.

4. Digital Copying

Digital copying can only be licensed either via email or by access to a licensed Press Cutting Agency (PCA) website. No other forms of digital copying are permitted. Emailed cuttings may be supplied by a PCA or may be created by the licensee themselves using scanning equipment. Alternatively, licensees may choose to view their cuttings on their PCA's website.

Licensees that copy digitally must complete an *Audit Sheet* detailing the number of cuttings, by publication, that have been emailed, and the number of staff that have received the emailed cuttings. In the case of PCA websites, the audit must detail the number of cuttings available, and the number of staff who are able to access the cuttings.

The fee due is calculated by multiplying the number of cuttings by either:

- (i) for emailed cuttings, the number of staff that the cuttings were sent to, or;
- (ii) for PCA websites, the number of users that are able to access the cuttings,

to give a total number of copies made in the 2-week audit period. This is then used to estimate the total annual number of copies made by your organisation which is then charged at a price per copy (see *Price List* for details) to arrive at the annual fee for digital copying and which is subject to an annual minimum fee.

5. Public Relations Consultancies and Trade or Professional Associations

PR agencies and trade/professional member organisations often wish to supply their clients or members with newspaper cuttings. If your organisation wishes to make this form of onward supply of cuttings please complete this section of the form together with a *Client Details Form*. The form lists the name of each client, along with details of how you wish to supply the cuttings e.g. photocopy or email and allows you to list any local/regional newspapers that you may need to copy from for each client. Fees are calculated per client according to the number of titles required as detailed on the *Price List*.

6. Indemnity for past copying

The licence start date for a new application will usually be the date the NLA receives the application. However organisations will normally have been copying for a considerable period before they apply for a licence, so an indemnity fee is usually due to cover the copying undertaken before the licence start date. If there is a long history of copying, the NLA is legally allowed to charge up to 6 years indemnity under the Limitations Act 1980. The indemnity fee is usually a multiple of the current year fee.

However, not all companies have copied for 6 years or more, so the indemnity may be reduced, provided the licensee is able to prove that they have not copied for that length of time. Proof may include confirmation that a company is less than 6 years old, or copies of any formal policies that the company has in place to prevent the unlicensed copying of newspaper cuttings.

Contact Information

Please complete the application form by providing the name, telephone number and email details of the member of your staff that the NLA should contact in the event of any queries. The licence should then be signed on behalf of your organisation by an appropriate member of staff. In many cases, the contact and signatory are the same person. *Audit Sheets* and *UK & Foreign Newspaper Lists* should also be signed on behalf of the applicant.

What happens next?

Once signed, all forms and a copy of your letterhead should be returned to the NLA by either post, fax or email. **Please remember to keep a copy for your records.**

Upon receipt of the completed forms, a member of the NLA team will contact you with a quote. Once the quote has been confirmed an invoice will be sent to you for payment within 30 days and a licence certificate will be sent to you confirming the grant of your NLA licence.



THE LAW ON COPYRIGHT

Copyright in a written work has been protected in England since at least 1529. The principal source of copyright law is now the Copyright, Designs and Patents Act 1988 as amended.

Infringement of copyright is a tort (civil wrong) for which redress is available to the copyright owner in the civil courts. If the infringement is established, then the defendant may be ordered to pay damages and to deliver up infringing material as well as to be bound by an injunction against further infringement. An employer may be liable for copying undertaken by members of its staff even if this is for their own personal use and even if they are expressly prohibited from doing so.

Collective licensing schemes such as that operated by the NLA are recognised by the Act. Anyone who is unreasonably refused a licence or who considers that the terms of licence available to him would be unreasonable may refer the licensor to the Copyright Tribunal, which has then to decide the issue between the applicant and the licensing body or even impose the terms that it considers would be reasonable. The current NLA scheme has been the subject of reference to the Copyright Tribunal which has accepted the general scope of the scheme.

Organisations that never copy cuttings from newspapers other than as permitted by the Act are encouraged to sign a declaration to that effect. There are two forms, one for professional partnerships and the other for companies and other organisations.

The NLA has brought civil actions for infringement of both typographical arrangement copyright and, most recently, literary copyright.

The first was in the Clerkenwell County Court against Islington Borough Council. Judgment was given for the NLA: see the NLA's press release of 2 October 1998.

The second, against Marks and Spencer p.l.c. ("M&S") went to the House of Lords, which held, on 12 July 2001, that M&S did not breach the NLA's copyright in the typographical arrangement of newspaper cuttings. That decision does not affect the NLA's entitlement to enforce literary copyright mandated to it. The Court of Appeal's decision in the case against M&S also makes it clear that copying of articles will not be excused by being considered to be fair dealing for the purpose of reporting news and current events.

The litigation with M&S has now settled on terms that M&S have now taken a standard NLA licence to copy newspaper cuttings for its internal management and information purposes.

There have been a number of other instances in which, although it did not come to the issue of proceedings, payments have been paid to the NLA for unlicensed copying. Payments have been made by, among others:-

Frequently Asked Questions

1) Why have you contacted us?

We are systematically contacting all companies and organisations in the UK to establish if you have a requirement to reproduce newspaper articles using any format.

2) What does the Newspaper Licensing Agency (NLA) do?

The scheme operated by the NLA offers anybody copying newspaper cuttings, whether it is done occasionally or on a regular basis, a simple easy way to ensure that they don't breach the copyright of the newspaper. The NLA licence offers a single point of contact for permission to copy from over 1500 newspaper titles.

3) What authority does the NLA have to operate the scheme?

The NLA is licensed by the newspaper publishers and operates as a Collecting Society under the terms of the Copyrights Designs & Patents Act 1988

4) What is Copyright?

Anything that appears in a newspaper is owned by the publisher. In general, the law protects creators, including publishers, against copying of their work by reprographic means. Protection is automatic and lasts for varying amounts of time. In the case of newspaper articles, copyright lasts for 25 years after the end of the year in which they were published. Copyright is the law, but more than that it's an essential part of the world of publishing and compensates the publishers for the use of their content.

5) We have always copied from newspapers. Why do we suddenly need a licence now?

There has always been a legal requirement to have permission to copy newspaper articles. Before the NLA was set up in 1996, organisations were required to contact the relevant publisher each time an article was copied. Since the inception of the NLA organisations are now required to contact us for a licence rather than each paper individually. It is a legal requirement to be licensed if you copy.

6) If we now stop copying, will that be all right?

Assuming you are confident that all copying will cease and a ban will be effective, you will not require licence. However you will still be required to pay a fee for all copying that has occurred in the past.

7) Why should we be expected to pay an indemnity fee?

An indemnity fee is due for all licensees who have copied newspaper cuttings prior to applying for a licence. The licence starts on the day you apply, and the indemnity covers you for any copying you have done before the licence start date. The indemnity fee is based on the annual licence fee and under the Limitations Act 1980, the NLA is able to charge you up to 6 times the annual fee to cover past unlicensed copying.

8) Aren't we covered under the arrangement with our PR/Press Cutting Agency (PCA)?

No. Every organisation that copies needs to have it's own licence. This applies if you copy stories cut straight from the newspaper or if you copy cuttings supplied by a third party such as a PR company or PCA.

9) What does the NLA licence not cover?

The licence does not cover any use of articles for public or commercial distribution or access, e.g. leaflets, business brochures and catalogues. The hosting of articles on publicly accessible websites is not covered. Please contact the relevant newspaper syndication department if you wish to copy something for use not covered by the licence.
