I.2 CROWN PROSECUTION SERVICE

The Crown Prosecution Service (CPS) was set up in 1986 as an independent authority to prosecute criminal cases investigated by the police in England and Wales. In undertaking this role, the CPS:

- Advises the police during the early stages of investigations; determines the appropriate charges in all but minor cases;
- Keeps all cases under continuous review and decides which cases should be prosecuted;
- Prepares cases for prosecution in court, prosecutes the case with in house advocacy or instructs agents and counsel to present cases; and
- Provides information and assistance to victims and prosecution witnesses.

The CPS is headed by a director who acts under the superintendence of the Attorney General and is accountable to Parliament for the Service.

I.4 SERIOUS FRAUD OFFICE

The Serious Fraud Office (SFO) was established by the Criminal Justice Act 1987, following the 1986 Roskill Report. Under that Act its role is to investigate and prosecute cases of serious or complex fraud in England, Wales and Northern Ireland and thus contribute to deterring such fraud.

As an integral part of the Criminal Justice System (CJS), the SFO must take into account and be part of developments in the wider world of law enforcement and financial regulation.

The SFO is headed by a director who acts under the superintendence of the Attorney General and is accountable to Parliament for the Service.
