<p>This DSCN informs users of the approval of a change to an Information Standard by the Information Standards Board for Health and Social Care (ISB HaSC). This was approved by ISB HaSC at its meeting on 25 February 2009.</p>		
<p>Summary: The Commissioning Data Set (CDS) XML Message Schema is the message structure standard used for the submission of commissioning data to the Secondary Uses Service (SUS).</p> <p>Commissioning Data Set Schema Version 6-0 An updated release of CDS Schema Version 6-0 (2008-01-14) corrects errors in the previous version (6-0 2007-10-26) and no structural alterations have been made. Business Justification:	The updates to the Commissioning Data Set (CDS) XML schema are required to fulfil new requirements for the NHS, as set out in the associated Data Set Change Notices (DSCNs).

Introduction

The Commissioning Data Set (CDS) XML Message Schema is the message structure standard used for the submission of commissioning data to the Secondary Uses Service. The CDS schema design is capable of individually conveying many different CDS structures encompassing Accident and Emergency Attendances, Out-Patient Attendances, Admitted Patient Care and Elective Admission List data.

CDS Messages have been defined in component parts known as CDS Types. Each CDS Type as configured into the CDS Message carries only one CDS.

A new version of the CDS schema supports CDS Version 6-1, as introduced by DSCN 24/2008, and also some future changes to information standards, as identified below where applicable.

An updated version of the CDS Validation Table which supports CDS Version 6-1 is also made available at this release of the CDS Schema Version 6-1.

An updated version of the CDS Schema Version 6-0 (2008-01-14) is already in use by organisations submitting data to the Secondary Uses Service. This DSCN therefore merely updates the NHS Data Model and Dictionary with the current live version of the CDS schema.

Background

The change to CDS Schema Version 6-1 is required by NHS Connecting for Health (NHS CFH) and the Information Centre for Health and Social Care (IC) to enable CDS Version 6-1 to be safely transmitted to the Secondary Uses Service with appropriate validation following the publication of DSCNs by the ISB HaSC.

Corrections to minor typographical errors and the removal of an unnecessary code value have also been included.

Details of Change

The new CDS Schema Version 6-1 files are provided as an archived ZIP file. The associated computer generated documentation is provided as a series of HTML and picture files in a ZIP file. The release notes are included with the schema files as a Microsoft® Word file.

Ethnic Category

DSCN 11/2008 introduced the requirement to submit ETHNIC CATEGORY CODE in data sets which did not already include it. The schema will add an XML element to carry Ethnic Category to the Patient Characteristic Group of the following CDS:

- Type 010 – Accident And Emergency CDS
- Type 020 – Outpatient (Care Activity) CDS
- Type 021 – Future Outpatient (Future Care Activity) CDS (note – this is a placeholder only as this data set is not yet approved for use by ISB HaSC)

Mental Health Act 2007 Mental Category

The Mental Health Act 2007 redefines Mental Category. New classifications are to be used from 3rd November 2008.

Mental Category is carried within CDS Type 170 - Admitted Patient Care – Detained And/Or Long Term Psychiatric Census CDS. The existing classifications must be used for the March 2008 Census while the new classifications must be used for the March 2009 Census.

The existing element that carries MENTAL CATEGORY will be retained but should not be used for the March 2009 Census.

A new element to carry MENTAL HEALTH ACT 2007 MENTAL CATEGORY was defined in DSCN 21/2008 (which updated the definition used in DSCN 06/2008). The permitted code values are listed in the following table.

Code	Significance
A	Mental disorder (Learning Disability not present or not primary reason for using Act)
B	Mental disorder (Learning Disability primary reason for using Act)
8	Not Applicable (Not Detained)
9	Not Known

Registered General Medical Practitioner

Since 2004 patients have registered with a practice rather than a GP within a practice. DSCN 03/2008 introduced the requirement for a number of changes to CDSs as specified in the NHS Data Model & Dictionary; in particular:

- Registered GMP renamed as Specified GMP.
- The status of Specified GMP to be changed from required to optional.
- The status of GP Practice to be changed from optional to required.

The existing element that carries GMP (CODE OF REGISTERING OR REFERRING GP) has been renamed to match the new Data Dictionary name of GENERAL MEDICAL PRACTITIONER (SPECIFIED).

The existing element that carries CODE OF GP PRACTICE (REGISTERED GMP) has been renamed to match the new Data Dictionary name of GENERAL MEDICAL PRACTICE CODE (PATIENT REGISTRATION).

Commissioning Data Set Type 021 Future Outpatients

Although this data set has not yet been approved for use by ISB HaSC, it has been updated where necessary, to include changes made with the introduction of CDS Version 6-1.

Correction of minor typographical error

The structure PersonGroupPatient_Delivery_Structure is referenced in the following CDSs:

- Type 140 - Admitted Patient Care - Finished Delivery Episode CDS
- Type 160 - Admitted Patient Care - Other Delivery Event CDS
- Type 200 - Admitted Patient Care - Unfinished Delivery Episode CDS

This structure contains the attribute UnvalidatedNHSNumberStatusIndicator_.

The trailing underscore is an error.

The structure PersonGroup_Mother_Structure, which is referenced in the following CDSs, has the same error:

- Type 120 - Admitted Patient Care - Finished Birth Episode CDS
- Type 150 - Admitted Patient Care - Other Birth Event CDS
- Type 180 - Admitted Patient Care - Unfinished Birth Episode CDS

The trailing underscore has been removed.

The 'Type' has been removed from the component ns:EarliestReasonableOfferDate.

Resolution of schema issue: Intended Procedure Date

In CDS Version 6-0, some Elective Admission List CDS types and the Future Outpatient CDS Type 021, carry Intended Procedure Code, but the standard data structure used also demands that an XML Mandatory Procedure Date is present. This is illogical and restrictive.

The following data sets are affected:

- CDS V6 TYPE 021 – FUTURE OUTPATIENT CDS
- CDS V6 TYPE 030 – EAL-END OF PERIOD CENSUS STANDARD CDS
- CDS V6 TYPE 050 – END OF PERIOD CENSUS NEW CDS
- CDS V6 TYPE 060 - EVENT DURING PERIOD – ADD CDS
- CDS V6 TYPE 110 – NEW SERVICE AGREEMENT CDS

The Procedure Date data item has been reverted to XML Optional (minOccurs="0") in all instances:

- PrimaryProcedureGroupOPCS
- PrimaryProcedureGroupREAD
- PrimaryProcedureGroupAAndE

Removal of unnecessary code value

Code value 15 was added to ADMISSION METHOD (HOSPITAL PROVIDER SPELL) in anticipation of change proposal CP784, Welsh Second Offer Scheme. This Change Proposal was not approved by ISB HaSC and so has been removed from the permitted values in the schema.

Updates to CDS Validation Table

A revised version of the CDS Validation Table has been produced to support the implementation of CDS Schema 6-1. The CDS Validation Table is available within the NHS Data Model and Dictionary, but is also provided as an excel file download from the NHS Data Model and Dictionary website, at <http://www.connectingforhealth.nhs.uk/systemsandservices/data/nhsdmds/cds-supporting>

Support for Future Developments

CDS Schema Version 6-1 (2008-04-01) also supports some planned data standards which have not yet been approved by ISB HaSC. These are as follows:

Administrative Event

New code values for data item FIRST ATTENDANCE are to be introduced, which would allow submission of a record via the Outpatient CDS type 020, where activity takes place outside a face-to-face or telemedicine patient contact.

To permit piloting of different approaches, additional code values for FIRST ATTENDANCE of 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9 have been included in the CDS Schema Version 6-1. Pending approval of an information standard by ISB HaSC (anticipated April 2009) a DSCN will be issued to give full details of the requirements.

NHS Number Status Indicator

The Human Fertilisation and Embryology Act 1990, as amended by the Human Fertilisation and Embryology (Disclosure of Information) Act 1992, imposed statutory restrictions on the disclosure of information about identifiable individuals in connection with certain infertility treatments.

There is currently no NHS Number Status Code to allow a provider to report that the NHS number has been withheld from submissions and there is no code to allow SUS to report that it has withheld the NHS Number.

A standard currently under development and sponsored by the Digital Policy Unit, Department of Health, proposes two new codes:

Code	Significance
90	Patient identity withheld from submission
91	Patient identity withheld by reporting system

Note that code value 91 is only used on output from the Secondary Uses Service (SUS) and so is not supported in the schema. Code 90 has however been added to facilitate timely implementation once the standard has been approved via ISB HaSC.

If the value of NHS Number Status Indicator is '90', the message will not support the use of the following data:

- LOCAL PATIENT IDENTIFIER
- NHS NUMBER
- PATIENT NAME
- PATIENT USUAL ADDRESS

- POSTCODE OF USUAL ADDRESS
- PERSON BIRTH DATE

CDS Schema 6-1 also enforces the rule (introduced in DSCN 08/98/P08) that the presence of any NHS number stops the flow of name and address details. This applies to validated (i.e. passes the check digit calculation) as well as verified (with an NHS Number Status of 01) NHS numbers. This requirement will be reaffirmed in the DSCN.

In addition, and as shown in DSCN 24/2008 CDS Tables Version 6-1, the data element PERSON BIRTH DATE has been repositioned in the standard design of the schema Identity Structure, to facilitate the removal of identifiable information to comply with Anonymisation rules above. PERSON BIRTH DATE was previously carried in the Patient Characteristics data group.

Notes:

1. Relevant organisations are those organisations as defined in the standard who must take direct action to implement the standard
2. IT Suppliers are all suppliers to the organisations listed at ¹ who supply functionality pertinent to that standard
3. **Effective Date** is the date from which a new standard can be used but may not be mandatory. This might facilitate piloting, for example, or enable time for system functionality development. At this point, **you “may use” the standard.**
4. **Implementation Date** is the point from which the new standard becomes mandatory. Ideally, it inherently implies organisations use appropriate systems i.e. the date is the same for organisations and suppliers. However, there may be circumstances where interim workarounds are required i.e. the date is different for organisations and suppliers. At this date, **you “must use” the standard.** Where the standard demands data is submitted centrally, sub components of implementation date (and possibly ‘effective date’) are:
 5. **Collection Start Date** – this is the date collection of data must begin
 6. **First Submission Date** – this is the date of first submission of data centrally
 7. **Reporting Period / Submission Cycle** – If the standard calls for further collection and submission at defined intervals, this cell provides text of the reporting period (e.g. calendar month, financial year) and the submission cycle (e.g. submit data monthly on the 10th working day of the subsequent month).
8. **Conformance Date** is the date from which the service and IT system suppliers must use the standard as envisaged i.e. using appropriate IT solutions rather than interim workarounds and, if the standard requires it, an independent, authoritative body or legitimate internal audit would conduct a conformity assessment with the expectation of full conformance by all relevant parties. It is the **“must use standard effectively and assessed for use”** date
9. **Superseded Date** of the prior standard sets the date at which the prior standard is replaced by the new standard i.e. the prior standard must no longer be used. This date will apply only where there was a pre-existing standard made redundant by the new standard. It might be different from preceding dates in the framework if, for example, a new and old standard run in parallel for a period. It is the date from which you **“stop using the prior standard”**.

Background:

The Commissioning Data Set XML Message Schema is the message structure standard used for the submission of commissioning data to the Secondary Uses Service. The Commissioning Data Set Schema design is capable of individually conveying many different Commissioning Data Set structures encompassing Accident and Emergency Attendances, Out-Patient Attendances, Admitted Patient Care, and Elective Admission List data.

Commissioning Data Set Schema Version 6-0

An updated release of Commissioning Data Set Schema Version 6-0 (2008-01-14) corrects errors in the previous version (6-0 2007-10-26) and no structural alterations have been made.

The requirement for publication is only that the NHS Data Dictionary is brought up to date to display this as the latest version. The existing version in the NHS Data Dictionary (6-0 2007-10-26) may not be used due to the known issues fixed by this latest version. This has no impact upon current users of the Commissioning Data Set Schema Version 6-0, as they were supplied with this later version during their testing for Commissioning Data Set version 6-0.

Commissioning Data Set Schema Version 6-1

A new Commissioning Data Set Schema Version 6-1 (2008-04-01) supporting Commissioning Data Set Version 6-1 is also introduced to the NHS Data Dictionary, in readiness for the requirement to submit the changes introduced in several Data Set Change Notices, from April 2009. These Data Set Change Notices are as follows:

- DSCN 24/2008 - introduced changes to the Commissioning Data Set tables for Commissioning Data Set Version 6-1
- DSCN 11/2008 - introduced the requirement to submit ETHNIC CATEGORY CODE in all Commissioning Data Set types which did not already include it
- DSCN 21/2008 - introduced a new data element to carry MENTAL HEALTH ACT 2007 MENTAL CATEGORY (this updated the definition introduced in DSCN 06/2008)
- DSCN 03/2008 - introduced changes to the naming of General Medical Practitioner and GP Practice.

Commissioning Data Set Schema Version 6-1 (2008-04-01) also supports some planned data standards which have not yet been approved by the Information Standards Board for Health and Social Care. These are as follows:

- Referral to Treatment Period Clock Stop Administrative Event - requires a new value for attribute FIRST ATTENDANCE to be carried in the Commissioning Data Set Version 6-1 Type 020 Out-Patients

- NHS Number Status Indicator - introduces two new values for this attribute (codes 90 and 91) to allow the correct submission of Commissioning Data Sets where the patients identity has been withheld

Finally, Commissioning Data Set Schema Version 6-1 (2008-04-01) also:

- corrects minor typographical errors in previous schema versions
- resolves a schema issue relating to Intended Procedure Date
- removes unnecessary code values
