

TRANSHIPMENT LICENCE

Open General Transhipment Licence dated 14 August 2003 granted by the Secretary of State.

The Secretary of State, in exercise of powers conferred by Articles 2 and 5(1) of the Import of Goods (Control) Order 1954^(a) ("the Imports Order"), and now vested in him^(b), and of his powers under Articles 3(a) and 7 of the Export of Goods (Control) Order 1994^(c) ("the Exports Order") hereby grants the following Open General Transhipment Licence:

Interpretation

1. In this Licence, unless the context otherwise requires:
 - (a) "controlled goods" means goods specified in Part III of Schedule 1 to the Exports Order, Annex I to Council Regulation (EC) No. 1334/2000^(d) or Schedule 2 to the UK Regulations and technology which includes any information relating to any such goods;
 - (b) "importation" and "exportation" mean respectively importation into and exportation from the United Kingdom;
 - (c) "transhipment" means the transit through the United Kingdom or transhipment of imported goods with a view to the re-exportation, whether or not they remain on board an aircraft or ship for the

period that they remain in the United Kingdom or are goods on a through air waybill or through bill of lading;

- (d) "the UK Regulations" means the Dual-Use Items (Export Control) Regulations 2000^(a);
- (e) "unrestricted goods from the Channel Islands" means goods exported from any of the Channel Islands under a licence permitting their exportation to any destination; and
- (f) any other expression used in this Licence shall have the meaning it bears in the Import, Export and Customs Powers (Defence) Act 1939^(b), the Exports Order or the UK Regulations.

Importation of goods for transshipment and subsequent exportation

- 2. Subject to the following provisions of this Licence, this Licence authorises the importation for transshipment and the subsequent exportation of any goods.

Limitations of Licence

- 3. This Licence does not authorise the exportation of -
 - (a) any goods specified in Schedule 1 hereto to any destination, or of any other controlled goods (other than unrestricted goods from the Channel Islands) to a destination in a country specified in Schedule 2 hereto, unless (in either case) the exportation is for their use in connection with the activities of any of -

- (i) the NATO led Stabilisation Force (SFOR);
 - (ii) the Peace Implementation Conference and the Office of the High Representative (OHR);
 - (iii) European Community Monitor Mission;
 - (iv) the Organisation for Security and Co-operation in Europe Mission;
 - (v) the United Nations and its specialised agencies; and
 - (vi) diplomatic missions of member states of the European Union or the Organisation for Security and Co-operation in Europe; or
- (b) any dual-use items which are not goods in transit within the meaning of Article 3(4) of the Council Regulation (EC) No. 1334/2000 and Article 2(2) of the Exports Order; or
- (c) any goods which fall within Group 2 of Part I of Schedule 1 to the Export of Goods (Control) Order 1992^(a) (antiques); or
- (d) any goods in respect of which-
- (i) the exporter has been informed by a competent authority of the Member State where he is established that they are or may be intended, in their entirety or in part, for use in connection with the development, production, handling, operation, maintenance, storage, detection, identification or dissemination of chemical, biological or nuclear weapons, or other nuclear explosive devices or the development, production, maintenance or storage of missiles

capable of delivering such weapons,

- (ii) if the exporter is aware that the items in question are intended, in their entirety or in part, for any of the uses referred to in sub-paragraph (i);
 - (iii) if the exporter has grounds for suspecting that the items in question are or may be intended, in their entirety or in part, for any of the uses referred to in sub-paragraph (1), unless the exporter has made all reasonable enquiries as to their proposed use and is satisfied that the items will not be so used; or
- (e) any goods specified in Schedule 1, 2 or 3 to the Annex on Chemicals annexed to the Convention on the Prohibition of the Development, Production, Stockpiling and Use of Chemical Weapons and on their Destruction signed at Paris on 13th January 1993^(a)."

4. This Licence does not authorise the importation of -
- (a) any goods originating in Iraq, or
 - (b) any other goods the exportation of which is not authorised by this Licence.

Conditions

5. The authority in paragraph 2 above is subject to the following conditions:
- (a) the goods shall be exported within 30 days of importation, or such longer period as the Commissioners of Customs and Excise may permit; and

- (b) official and commercial documentation accompanying unrestricted goods from the Channel Islands shall include a copy of the export licence authorising their exportation from the Channel Islands.
6. The requirements of article 8 of the Exports Order shall not apply to an export under this Licence.

Prohibitions not affected by this Licence

7. Nothing in this Licence affect any prohibition or restriction on the importation or exportation or the carrying out of any act with respect of the importation and exportation of any goods concerned under, or by virtue of, any enactment other than a prohibition or restriction in the legislation under which this Licence is issued, as set out in the licence itself.

Entry into Force

8. This Licence shall come into force on 15 August 2003.

Revocation

9. The Open General Transhipment Licence dated 28 September 2000 is hereby revoked.

SCHEDULE 1

GOODS CONCERNED

Goods licensed to be exported for limited uses only

1. Goods specified in Group 2 of Part I of Schedule 1 to the Exports Order.
2. Goods specified in Part III of Schedule 1 to the Exports Order which:
 - (a) are specified in entry ML1, ML2, ML3, ML4, ML6, ML7, ML8, ML17g, PL5001, PL5006, PL5020 or PL5030; or
 - (b) are castings, forgings and semi-finished products specified in entry ML16, being specially designed for goods specified in entry ML1, ML2, ML3, ML4 or ML6; or
 - (c) have any of the functions or characteristics of information security described in Category 5 (Part 2 - Information Security) of Annex 1 to Council Regulation (EC) No. 1334/2000 or in Schedule 2 to the UK Regulations;
4. Technology (within the meaning of article 1(2) of the Exports Order) related to any goods specified in any entry referred to in paragraph 3(a) or (c) of this Schedule.
5. Equipment and software, specified in entries ML18 or ML21 related to anti-personnel landmines or goods specified in PL5001.c or g.
6. Goods specified in Annex I to Council Regulation (EC) No. 1334/2000 or Schedule 2 of the UK Regulations which are:
 - (a) in Annex I under Category 0; or
 - (b) in Annex I under Category 5 (Part 2 - Information Security) or in any of the following entries: 1C239, 3A229, 3A232 and 4D003 head(c); or
 - (c) in Schedule 2 in either the following entries: 1C991, 1C992.

SCHEDULE 2

DESTINATIONS CONCERNED

This export authorisation is valid for exports to the following destinations:

All destinations other than in:

Afghanistan, Albania, Angola, Argentina, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Burma (Myanmar), Burundi, Croatia, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Eritrea, Estonia, Ethiopia, Georgia, India, Indonesia, Iran, Iraq, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Latvia, Liberia, Libya, Lithuania, the Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Moldova, Mongolian People's Republic, Nigeria, North Korea, Pakistan, People's Republic of China (including Hong Kong and Macau Special Administrative Region), Romania, Russian Federation, Rwanda, Serbia and Montenegro, Sierra Leone, Slovenia, Socialist Republic of Vietnam, Somalia, Sudan, Syria, Tajikistan, Tanzania, Turkmenistan, Uganda, Ukraine, Uzbekistan and Zimbabwe.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the licence)

1. This Licence has been amended by updating references to goods shown in Schedule 1, following recent issue of an amendment to the Export of Goods (Control) Order, and changing the name of the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia to Serbia and Montenegro.
2. This Licence permits the importation for transshipment and subsequent exportation of goods not in Schedule 1 to any destination in a country not in Schedule 2. Goods in Schedule 1, and goods not in Schedule 1 the export of which is controlled as military or dual-use items and which are destined for a country in Schedule 2, may be exported for limited uses only. In the case of goods not in Schedule 1 which have been licensed for export from the Channel Islands to any destination, exportation is permitted to any destination without limit on use. The licence does not cover exports for purposes connected with nuclear, chemical or biological weapons or missiles for such weapons.
3. This authorisation is subject to certain conditions, and does not extend to the importation of goods originating in Iraq.
4. The conditions attached to this Licence include that the goods are exported within 30 days of importation, or such longer period as Customs may permit.
5. This Licence does not extend to any prohibition under legislation other than the Import of Goods (Control) Order 1954 or the Export of Goods (Control) Order 1994; in particular it does not extend to other legislation implementing United Nations sanctions or controlling the export of dual-use items.
