PARTICULARS OF INTERVIEW:

I am Chief Inspector [REDACTED] and I am investigating Discipline Matters arising from Form(s) 17/3 which were served on you by Sergeant [REDACTED] on 18 May 1998. I am going to read out the contents of the Form 17/3 and your response after it was served on you. I have to caution you in the following words:-

You do not have to say anything but I must caution you that if you do not mention when questioned something which you later rely on in any subsequent disciplinary proceedings, it may harm your defence. You may, if you so desire, make a written or oral statement to the Investigating Officer or the Chief Constable or the Police Authority, as appropriate. Anything you mention when questioned or any written or oral statement you make may be given in evidence at such disciplinary proceedings.

Do you understand the contents of the Form(s) 17/3 served on you and also the Discipline Caution.

Reply: Yes.

Have you received a copy of the Notes for Guidance - Evidence by Inference and a List of Friends.

Reply: Yes.

You can have a friend present during this interview. I asked, "Do you wish a friend to be present at this interview?"

Q. Can you say what duty you were on at 2030 hours on 15 December 1997?

A. I was driver. I was on late duty accompanied by Constable Meeke and Constable Patterson. We were DMP in the Lurgan town area.

Q. Were you tasked to convey a prisoner who had been arrested by R/Constable Burrows at Wellworths Store to Lurgan Station?

A. I was, yes.

Q. Who responded with you?

A. Two of us responded to the call. I cannot remember whether it was Constable Meeke or Constable Patterson that went with me.

Q. Was Shane McCrory palced into the police car?

A. He was. Yes.

Q. Shane McCrory claims that there were 4 policeman in the car. Could there have been?

A. I'm not really sure. I know there was swapping about for interview that night. There was a major incident later on when I know there were three of us in the car but I cannot remember when the third man joined us.

Q. Where was the prisoner seated in the car?

A. I cannot remember whether he was behind me or the passenger.

Q. Where was R/Constable Burrows seated?

A. In the rear but I don't know which side either.

Q. Shane McCrory alleges that during the journey R/Constable Burrows said to him, "Nelson won't help you this time." Did you hear R/Constable Burrows say that?

A. No.
