When examining this undisclosed intelligence it is important to bear in mind policy decision 19 of the 16th March 1999 which records the specific intelligence requests made to the Regional Head of Special Branch and the additional requests made at the meetings of the 26th March 1999 and 8th April 1999 and those included in documents DRIBA, DRIBF and DRIBH. I would have expected my requests for intelligence to have gone thereafter to [B567] and then to other regions for reply. I would not have expected, of necessity, that everything would have been routed through the E3 desks at Headquarters. For example, if E3B was asked to provide information, I would have expected that to have happened at DI [B567]'s request. I was expecting the rest of Special Branch in the regions to deal with the Liaison Officer who was DI [B567]

117. During the course of my interviews, I have been shown a number of intelligence documents and I comment on each of them below. I wish to make it clear that it is several years now since I was involved with the investigation and such was the volume of material that the MIT generated, it is impossible for me to be certain in some cases whether I saw or knew of the information. However, I am certain that important intelligence such as that [REDACTED] the claim of responsibility, the missing explosive device in Belfast and the information [REDACTED] UCBT before Mrs Nelson's death were never disclosed to me. I have done the best I can in the circumstances to provide accurate answers. I will comment initially on non-disclosed intelligence identified by the Ayling team and then on the material discovered recently by the MIT and highlighted to the Inquiry in the second written statement of [M540]

118. Document D931821 dated 11/1/1999 **RNI 909.031-032, RNI-541.200-202** relates to the UFF bomb attack on Glen Greer by way of a UCBT. I do not recall seeing this intelligence but it related to one of a chain of Loyalist devices and [REDACTED] was a nominal on the J404 account and was a suspected bomb-maker. I knew of him from my Belfast days.
