5' 9". I don't know whether I would be able to recognise him again. Later that evening, about 11.30 pm, Sharon Kealey, a Solicitor in Rosemary Nelson's office, came to see me. I had a private consultation with her. I was not interviewed before speaking with her. I told her that I was surprised to see her as the Police had told me I couldn't see a Solicitor. I was detained in Gough Barracks for the following four days, during which time I was interviewed about fifteen times by a total of six CID officers. I was interviewed by pairs of officers but the pairs would not always be the same, some officers not always interviewing with the same partner. I would describe the six officers as follows: (1) Blond haired, in his 40s/50s, very stout build, clean shaven, about 5' 10" to 6'. (2) Had a grey beard, in his 40s/50s, about 6', medium build. (3) Black hair (short spiky), clean shaven, in his 30s/40s, medium build. (4) Young fellow, 20s/30s, black hair, thin build, about 5' 6" to 5' 9", clean shaven, he seemed to be very religious from the way he spoke. (5) He seemed the oldest, in his late 50s, wore glasses when he was writing or reading, I think grey hair, about 5' 9"; I remember him having a Hill Street Presbyterian pen. (6) Had dark hair, stocky build, clean shaven, about 6', in his late 30s/early 40s; I believe this Detective told me that he had interviewed my girlfriend. I think the officer I described as having short black spiky hair (number 3) was called **P162*** I remember him as being the nicest of them. I remember the first two officers (1 and 2) I have described the best as they were the most aggressive during the interviews. I was interviewed on the morning of Friday 7th February 1997 but refused to answer any of their questions until I had seen my Solicitor. At lunch
