- 32. I know Rosie was well respected around this end of town, and even at the top of town. To explain, Lurgan is split in half, with the top of the town being Protestant and the bottom Catholic. She even took cases from there. She had done a murder case up there. She was like any solicitor. She would just take a case - you can't refuse a case on the basis of religion, or colour, or creed. She didn't just work for Catholics, she was just like any other solicitor and would just take a new client. When I was in her office, there wasn't only one side, there were people from both sides. A solicitor is a solicitor to me, and that's how I take them!
- 33. I don't know much about her other work as a solicitor. All I know is that she was a general solicitor, and did home buying, and claims, and whatever a solicitor does. She had had a couple of big cases, but generally she was just a solicitor. She had done bits and pieces for me before and she was very easy to speak to, which is why I used her. She was one of the first women solicitors in this town and was well established. She had lodged a claim for me in the past so I just kept using her.
- 34. I couldn't say whether Rosie had any particular causes or passions, I just don't know. I didn't know her socially, although I might see her when I was out and have a bit of craic with her, or if I was in her office she might bring me a cup of coffee and we would have a chat. I couldn't tell you about any political affiliations she had. I don't know anything about her being connected to the Provos and never heard any suggestion that she was.
