Tuesday 11th February - arrested at 10am from home with my brother. We were the only two from the house arrested. The police came down and raided the house, they searched and wrecked the house. They came up and said 'all out of bed now' They brought tool kits in and started in the scullery, taking things apart - there were about 7 of them. My parents one wee sister and two wee brothers were in the house. We were all in the living room, one policeman kept coming in. I went out to the scullery and one cop said to the other "that's the bastard there". All the policemen were in the scullery and then they went upstairs and started in our room. I had Loughgall and prisoners posters on the wall. They turned the beds upside down, there were clothes everywhere.

There were two photos missing later - one of himself and one of the two brothers standing together - hasn't found them since.

They came back downstairs and chased us into the scullery, they started to search the living room. They took away a hand held CB and electrical tape. They asked Colm did the CB belong to him and what it was used for - he answered that it's broken. It was put in a bag and another one came in and started laughing.

They all left the house and left their tool kits in the hall and came in with another two. We were arrested under section 14B and cautioned. We got into a landrover and they said "you're going to be a long time in this place" - never said where they were taking me. I knew where I was when I arrived. They brought me into an interview room a big fellow came down, about 6ft Sergeant someone - asked me to empty my pockets. I was brought up and put into a cell. I was shouting to others in other cells. I was in the cell for about 1 hour. Then I was brought to an interview room, filled in a wee booklet. I was asked do you know why you're here. They said then you're here because you let a rocket off - admit it and we'll let you go. We've finger prints and everything. They asked me where I was that night - then told me where I worked. They told me there's Protestants working there - they've links with UVF, they could be sitting waiting on you - they told me the times I went for lunch. They said you're a target, your family's a target - the last person I said that to is in a wooden box. They talked about one of the Loughgall ones - [REDACTED]. They said you're number five down in the estate - Colin Duffy's number one they also mentioned [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] I laughed at them - they said my brother's number four. They were able to tell me where I was standing 3 hours before the rocket was fired. The interview lasted 1 hour - they were roaring and shouting in my ear.

I was interviewed 3 times on Tuesday, 4 times on Wednesday, 4 times on Thursday and 4 times on Friday.

At the first interview I was asked who my solicitor was - I said Rosemary Nelson. They asked "is Rosemary Nelson really a provo". I laughed and said "aye, she looks like one, doesn't she." Then after this interview I was brought back to my cell at about 11.30.

At the second interview I was brought down after lunch at 2.30-3.30pm. There were two different detectives. One was fattish with grey hair and a grey beard. The other
