From the explosion in Rosemary's car, it looked as though a mercury tilt bomb would have been used and there was no real history of that type of device being used amongst Loyalists. There may have been one example in Bangor but that was it.

15. There was a particular outcry at the killing of Rosemary because she was a woman. I remember being told by an acquaintance that the word on the street was that the killers should have gone for a more suitable target such as Brendan McKenna. That is not to suggest that Rosemary was not in fact the intended target on this occasion [REDACTED]

16. Rosemary dealt with the threats she received by reporting these to Param Kumaraswamy to try to get greater security for herself by publicising the risks she was under. The more publicity these issues generated, the safer she felt. I think that, if she suspected collusion, she was in any event going to be reluctant to report her concerns to the Police as that was originally where she felt the threats were coming from.
17. I have been shown an article I authored dated 7 March 1998 [REDACTED]
[REDACTED]. I had forgotten that the man I saw at Rosemary's office who repeated comments made to him by the Police had actually been held at Castlereagh. Looking at this article again, I think I may actually have arranged to see this man and to interview him rather than it being a coincidence that he was at Rosemary's office at the same time as me. It certainly highlights how concerned she was.
18. I have also been shown an article I authored dated 29 August 1997 [REDACTED]
