

60. In the searches that followed the arrest of **Mohammed Shakil** the police recovered other computers containing similar material that we shall examine in more detail during the trial. At **Mohammed Shakil's** home address, [Personal information], Leeds, the police found a typed sheet of paper providing guidance on how to get money to the Taliban – **exhibit DMH/3 [yellow jury bundle page 385]**. **Mohammed Shakil's** fingerprints were found on that piece of paper.

Links with the London bombers

61. So far we have looked at items found separately at addresses associated with the defendants. However, in their review of material recovered in the aftermath of the London bombings the police discovered a number of items that establish a connection between these defendants and the London bombers.

Mohammed Siddique Khan (Edgware Road)

62. In July 2005, when they searched Mohammed Siddique Khan's home address, 69 Lees Holm, Dewsbury, the police found a number of items of interest, including:-

- a) a packet of photographs of a man in scuba diving gear (Mohammed Siddique Khan) – **exhibit ASH/96 [yellow jury bundle page 348]**. **Mohammed Shakil's** fingerprints are on the back of one of those photographs.
- b) a samurai sword in a case – **exhibit ASH/194 [cream jury bundle page 324]**. The fingerprints of both Waheed Ali (aka Shipon Ullah) and Hasib Hussein (Tavistock Square) were found on that sword.

63. During the search of [redacted] Dewsbury the police also found a booklet entitled "The Final Bequest" – **exhibit ASH/169 [cream jury bundle page 602]**. The police compared that booklet ("The Final Bequest") with another document they had recovered a few days earlier, namely the Islamic Will and Testament of Siddique Khan – **exhibit INM/5 [cream jury bundle page 448]**. On doing so, they discovered that pages 11-16 of Mohammed Siddique Khan's will have been photocopied from the booklet "The Final Bequest". That booklet bears the fingerprints of both Waheed Ali (aka Shipon Ullah) and Shehzad Tanweer (Aldgate).

64. Among the debris at the scene of the Edgware Road bombing the police found part of a mobile telephone belonging to Mohammed Siddique Khan. In the memory of that mobile telephone was recorded a mobile telephone number attributable to **Mohammed Shakil** against the name "SHAXMOB" and a mobile telephone number attributable to **Sadeer Saleem** recorded against the name "Sads".

65. The closeness of Waheed Ali (aka Shipon Ullah) to Mohammed Siddique Khan is demonstrated by a text message sent by Waheed Ali (aka Shipon Ullah) to Mohammed Siddique Khan on the 7th December 2003
