Level Crossing Incident Rawcliffe Bridge near Goole, East Yorkshire

This incident was originally investigated by HSE but responsibility for any related subjects/work areas has now moved to ORR.

HSE's HM Railway Inspectorate's investigation into the fatal accident and train derailment at Creykes Level Crossing, Rawcliffe Bridge nr Goole, East Yorkshire on 30 June 2005 concluded that the crossing was functioning as designed and that the accident occurred because the car driver did not stop at the crossing when the train was approaching. At the inquest, which was held in Hull Coroners Court on 16th November 2005, a verdict of accidental death was recorded.
