I attach alternative draft replies, together with the invitation and the earlier papers relating to Rupert Murdoch's invitation to the "special celebration" on 1 September.

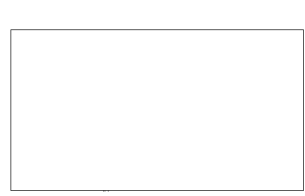
I have discovered that the celebration is to do with launching new Sky TV channels.
