Aim of course

To prepare Officers for appointment as a Navigating Officer in a Corvette or Patrol Craft.

- ◆ The correct use of navigation aids and equipment
- ◆ Two weeks of instruction and assessment in practical pilotage (visual and blind) will be conducted in the RN simulator and at sea.
- ◆ Short Introduction to Warship ECDIS and related electronic navigation procedures.
- ◆ Pilotage
- ◆ Basic ship handling
- ◆ Relative velocity
- ◆ International Regulations for Prevention of Collisions at Sea

Entry standards

- ◆ Senior Sub-Lieutenant or Junior Lieutenant with the equivalent of the RN's Bridge Watch keeping Certificate and prior to appointment as Navigating Officer of a Corvette or Patrol Craft

Examinations / qualifications gained

Practical assessment in navigation and pilotage conducted in the RN simulator and a suitable warship plus continuous assessment and final examination to RN standards in:

Rule of the Road	80%
Tides and Time	60%
Chartwork and Fixing	60%
General Navigation and Ship Handling	60%

(NOTE: Marks will be awarded for seatime assessment, 60% being the minimum standard to achieve certification). Successful students will be awarded an A, B or C Class Pass.

Post course recommendations

Immediate appointment as navigating officer to practice all navigation techniques covered on course as soon as possible.

Remarks

Students will be required to conduct practical navigation using correct terminology and procedures.
