DETAILS OF REPORT, ALLEGATION OR COMPLAINT:-

In a typed statement received via the Committee for the Administration of Justice (CAJ), the complainant alleges the following:-

- 1 Tuesday 11 February 1997 - arrested at 10 am from home with my brother. We were the only two from the house arrested. The Police came down and raided the house, they searched and wrecked the house. They came up and said 'all out of bed now'. They brought tool kits in and started in the scullery, taking things apart - there were about 7 of them. My parents, one wee sister and two wee brothers were in the house. We were all in the living room, one Policeman kept coming in. I went out to the scullery and one cop said to the other "That's the bastard there." All the Policemen were in the scullery and then they went upstairs and started in our room. I had Loughgall and prisoners posters on the wall. They turned the beds upside down, there were clothes everywhere.
- 2 There were two photos missing later - one of himself and one of the two brothers standing together - hasn't found them since.

You do not have to say anything but I must caution you that if you do not mention when questioned something which you later rely on in any subsequent disciplinary proceedings, it may harm your defence. You may, if you so desire, make a written or oral statement to the Investigating Officer or the Chief Constable or the Police Authority, as appropriate. Anything you mention when questioned or any written or oral statement you make may be given in evidence at such disciplinary proceedings.

If this notice is served on you by an officer other than the Investigating Officer, you will be interviewed by the Investigating Officer in due course.

You have the right to consult a 'friend' at all stages.
