Then after about another half an hour they said that they were going to get the charge sheet and that I was definitely going to get charged. Then their Chief Inspector came in. I had seen him at the start of my detention and he had said that I would see him again when they were charging me. He only stayed for a few minutes and then they let me read the notes. When I got to the bottom it read that I was being released. I got out at about 5.15pm. They said that they file was being sent to the DPP.

It turned out that they had been out with my wife on a number of occasions when I was in Castlereagh asking her about my movements and threatening to take the children's clothes.
