

other things that they accused me of having done in the early 90s but they did not go into detail. They asked me why my car was in [REDACTED] which is where [REDACTED] was from. [REDACTED] lives just across the road).

#### Tuesday

This was basically the same again. They asked me if I wanted to do a deal. They said that they'd protect me and it would go well for me if I agreed. They told me that my brother Sam who was killed in 1990 had done a deal with them. I also saw Rosemary on the Tuesday. Then they began to question me about fibres which they said they had found in the front passenger seat of my car. I asked for my solicitor and Paddy came up.

#### Wednesday

They continued to question me about the murder of [REDACTED]. They said that the fibres came from his shirt. I asked for Rosemary and she came up but there was still no sign of a written caution. Then on Wednesday evening they served with a written caution. I asked to see my solicitor and Paddy came with a copy of the statement I had given typed out. After he had left I was taken back to my cell and then taken for interview. I think this was after 10pm. They started questioning me about the caution and I gave them the statement. One of them started to laugh and said that he didn't know I had a typewriter in my cell. Then they asked me in detail about the statement and I didn't reply.

#### Thursday

There was detailed questioning about the statement on the Thursday morning. I asked to see Rosemary and she came down at lunchtime. After she left they told me that they knew where I worked and that some day I could be set up by the LVF. They said that [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] would get me. They then told me that they had got another extension for two days. They asked me for addresses of the people I had named in the statement but I stayed silent.

#### Friday

In the morning I asked for Rosemary. They asked me if there was any way I could be connected with outhouses on [REDACTED] in [REDACTED] because I was to be charged with the murder that had taken place there. Sometimes they said that they knew that I didn't do it. Then they started talking about Rosemary. In the first interview on the Friday morning they said that the IRA had given her the statement which I had given them. They said that the IRA were pulling her strings. They also said that there was a new law passed in 1989 which meant they could do away with solicitors who concocted stories.

The two detectives that were doing this interview had gone right through since the day I was arrested. During the Saturday and Sunday there were two sets of two detectives and then one set was changed. There were then two sets of two who continued until I was released. The two who were in the interview on the Friday morning were the two who had been there every day since I was arrested. One was about 6ft, in his 40s, with grey/black hair which was receding and brushed back. He was the one who made all the comments about Rosemary. The other was fattish, with a moustache and brown hair in a side shade. He didn't say anything about her. I told Rosemary about what had happened and she advised me to make a complaint. I asked to speak to the officer in charge and I told the officer who appeared that I wanted to make a complaint about the CID, that they were making remarks about my solicitor. He said that that was nothing to do with him and that my solicitor should complain. I said she had advised me to make a complaint so then he recorded my complaint but not in detail.
