garage I decided to go to Lurgan Police Station. I arrived at Lurgan Police Station after 6 pm. I gave my name to the officer in the reception area who told me to take a seat. After waiting for about 30 minutes a uniformed officer came over to me and arrested me under Section 12 of the Prevention of Terrorism Act. I was then taken to Gough Barracks, arriving at about 7.30 pm. At Gough Barracks I was taken into a room by two uniform Constables where I waited a short while for a forensic man. While I was waiting I asked to see my Solicitor, Rosemary Nelson. The two uniformed officers told me that I could see her after I had been forensically examined. After the forensic examination I was taken upstairs to what I assumed was an interview room where I was left on my own. I asked the person who took me to this interview room, as he was about to leave me, if I could now see my Solicitor. He told me that I couldn't as it was too late. I can't remember whether it was one or two people who took me up to the interview room. I can't remember what the officer I spoke to about seeing my Solicitor looked like. At various times that evening officers would come into the room and ask me if I wanted to tell them something or make a statement. Each time I told them "No". I may have asked again if I could see my Solicitor but I was told "No". I just accepted this. I have thought about this matter and I am confused about when exactly I asked whether I could see my Solicitor and was told it was too late. It may have been when I was first taken up to the interview room or when officers came into the interview room. Although I can't be certain I think this officer might have been a Sergeant and I would describe him as male, in his 40s/50s, stocky build, with dark grey hair, about
