**SUBJECT:- COMPLAINT AGAINST POLICE BY ROSEMARY NELSON,
SOLICITOR AND HER CLIENT JAMES DONNELLY, [REDACTED]**

1. You will see from the attached correspondence that the above-named Solicitor and her client have made further complaints about threats.
2. I received a telephone call on 24 July 1998 from Brian McClelland, ICPC, enquiring if we would consider appointing Commander Mulvihill to investigate these two complaints B147/1988/98 and B147/1989/98. This Department had already nominated Chief Inspector [REDACTED] RUC Gough to investigate.
3. It would seem that ICPC intend that Ms G McNally will also supervise these two complaint investigations and therefore it would be open to ICPC not to approve any nominated investigating officer.
4. Given that ICPC presently seem to have no desire or expectation that all types of complaints made by R Nelson on behalf of her clients will be referred to non-RUC officers for investigation, I strongly recommend that we accede to the ICPC request. It would seem that by doing so we will provide ICPC and Mr Mulvihill with the opportunity to see through an investigation from start to finish.
5. There is a paucity of information in the Solicitor's letter but we believe that the complaints arise from the interview of James Donnelly in Castlereagh Holding Centre on 29 and 30 June 1998 when he was interviewed circa eleven times.
6. I recommend that the Chief Constable includes these two complaints amongst the matters to be investigated by Commander Mulvihill.
