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that I lost count after seven and as a consequence I find it difficult to attribute particular comments to particular interviews conducted by the second interviewing pair, however, the following was said to me. The comment that upset me most was made by the scruffy officer when he was talking about a man called Adrian Lamph, a catholic council worker from the Garvaghy Road who had been shot in the head a couple of months earlier. The scruffy officer was talking to me rather than questioning me and said that could be arranged to happen to you, or something similar. He then said something about me getting a made to measure sunroof and inferred that I would never know when something like that would happen to me. To me this officer originally seemed full of shit but as the interview went on and more comments followed I came to believe this was a threat against my life. On another occasion the scruffy officer said that my details could be given to [REDACTED] Locally [REDACTED] is believed to be a member of the LVF and a thug. He also asked me if I had a steel cage in my house and that it was about time I got one. I should clarify that a "steel cage" is a steel security door inside a front door and which prevents anyone seeking to attack you from entering your home. With regards to the reference to [REDACTED] this comment was made when they were asking me about who the intended targets of the blast bombs were, the RUC or the junior Orangemen. [REDACTED] is a prominent loyalist and if he was told I threw the bombs intending them to strike the Orangemen, then he would have me killed. Although I have referred to it earlier, I did not throw the bombs. Despite this the second interviewing pair made it clear that they needed to take
