3.66	<p>Are responsible for:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• maintaining a high level overview of all line operations</li> <li>• managing signal and line control centre activities on behalf of the Service Control Manager</li> <li>• acting as the senior manager during a disruption of the service and reporting directly to the Rostered Duty Officer out of core business hours in the event of a significant operating incident; and</li> <li>• directing and co-ordinating train services, station services, suppliers' staff and others to ensure that incidents are managed and controlled.</li> </ul>
