1.	"Stockton for Boilers" - Riley's of Stockton	This 18 month project will record and document the history of Riley Bros Boilermakers Ltd, a heavy engineering firm operating in Stockton-on-Tees between 1869 and 1979. Research about Riley Boilermakers will be collated from Stockton libraries, archives and museums including oral history interviews with former employees. An exhibition will be produced and shown in at least 3 venues	Cleveland Industrial Archaeology Society	Reject
2.	Heritage and conservation	This project plans to conserve and manage an ancient woodland and medieval meadow, recognise its biodiversity and preserve traditional skills related to the land. It will record and share the communities' memories of local history, traditional industries, Rigwood house and the surrounding area.	Be All You Can	Reject
3.	Telling Our Story - Ask the Experts	This community project will look at the cultural and natural heritage of North Shields. It will provide opportunities to explore local heritage through learning new skills, training, volunteering and recreational activities.	The Net North Shields	Award Grant of £5,600 (100%)

BRIDGE - Engineering Education	This 18 month practical, engineering focused bridge building project, aims to introduce young people to the science and creativity of structural engineering, within the context of the North East's bridge building heritage. The project will engage young people with the region's industrial and bridge building heritage, through a mix of school workshops and intergenerational activities.	Northern Architecture	Reject
5.	The Family La Bonche - who are we?	This project will explore and share the region's circus history. Young people will learn for the first time about the history, size, impact and cultural roots of the tradition of circus that they have become part of. The Family La Bonche, will lead the project and develop practical heritage skills that will enable them to explore circus history and circus identity.
