



Permit Access on Chippenham Fen NNR

Why do we have a permit system on Chippenham Fen?

Chippenham Fen was leased to the National Trust in 1946 as a nature reserve. It was then transferred to what was originally the Nature Conservancy (now Natural England), as custodians to protect the wildlife, species and habitats of the site in 1963. The lease of the site includes an expressed wish and a legal covenant between the owners and Natural England, that access away from the public right of way be restricted to visitors and students undertaking research projects on the site.

In order to maintain our obligations we run a permit system. We assess each request individually and if suitable we will issue a permit for 6months or 1 year. We are keen to encourage visitors to record or study the wildlife, geology, geography or history of the site.

We request that all students provide us with copies of any notable records or reports that they produce. In many instances we are happy to assist with recording projects or moving equipment around the site.

We request that insect recorders follow 'A Code Of Conduct For Collecting Insects And Other Invertebrates - Invertebrate Link (Joint Committee for the Conservation of British Invertebrates)- see website.
