You may confer with other officers who were present for an overview, but these notes are to assist YOUR recollection.

Background

- Set the scene: As fully as possible "on day, date, time, place, etc."
- State the information you had before attending the scene, this will help explain your actions.
- If notes were not made at scene, explain fully.
- Do not mention sensitive sources/techniques.

Action

- State what happened when you arrived.
- Record all questions asked/answers given both before and after caution. **Keep an open mind.** You are duty bound to gather all evidence and entitled to question any person from whom useful information can be obtained. **You should include hearsay.**
- Fully record your actions and the options considered **up to the point of arrest.**
- Show what factors influenced your decision, include reasons for *not* taking action.

On THURSDAY 4TH AUGUST 2011 I was on duty in plain clothes in company with other officers from [REDACTED] I was in possession of my personal issue Glock S&P and MP5 and was posted to [REDACTED] Control. I was deployed on Operation D:221 a proactive SC08 operation. I was the Operational Firearms Commander and Tactical Advisor to the Tactical Firearms commander. At about 1715 we departed for GUNDSMITH PATROL BASE whilst en route I was updated

Continued with intelligence from SCOR. Due ³⁴
to this intelligence and further intelligence
received over the next 30-40 miles
I provided tactical advice to the
TFC. In response to this at 1813hrs
my team carried out an interception
on a bronze colored people carrier
registration R343XPE one of the
occupants of this vehicle was believed
to be in possession of a firearm. The
vehicle stop was implemented in Fairy
Road, N17. As the stop was carried
out a road exited the roadside. As
I exited my vehicle I heard a
number of shots being fired and
the road fell to the ground. As soon
as he did this a number of officers
began to administer first aid. I
ensured the scene was secured and
all officers were safe. First Aid continued
until LAS/EMS arrived. After a short
time we all left the scene and returned
to HQ.
